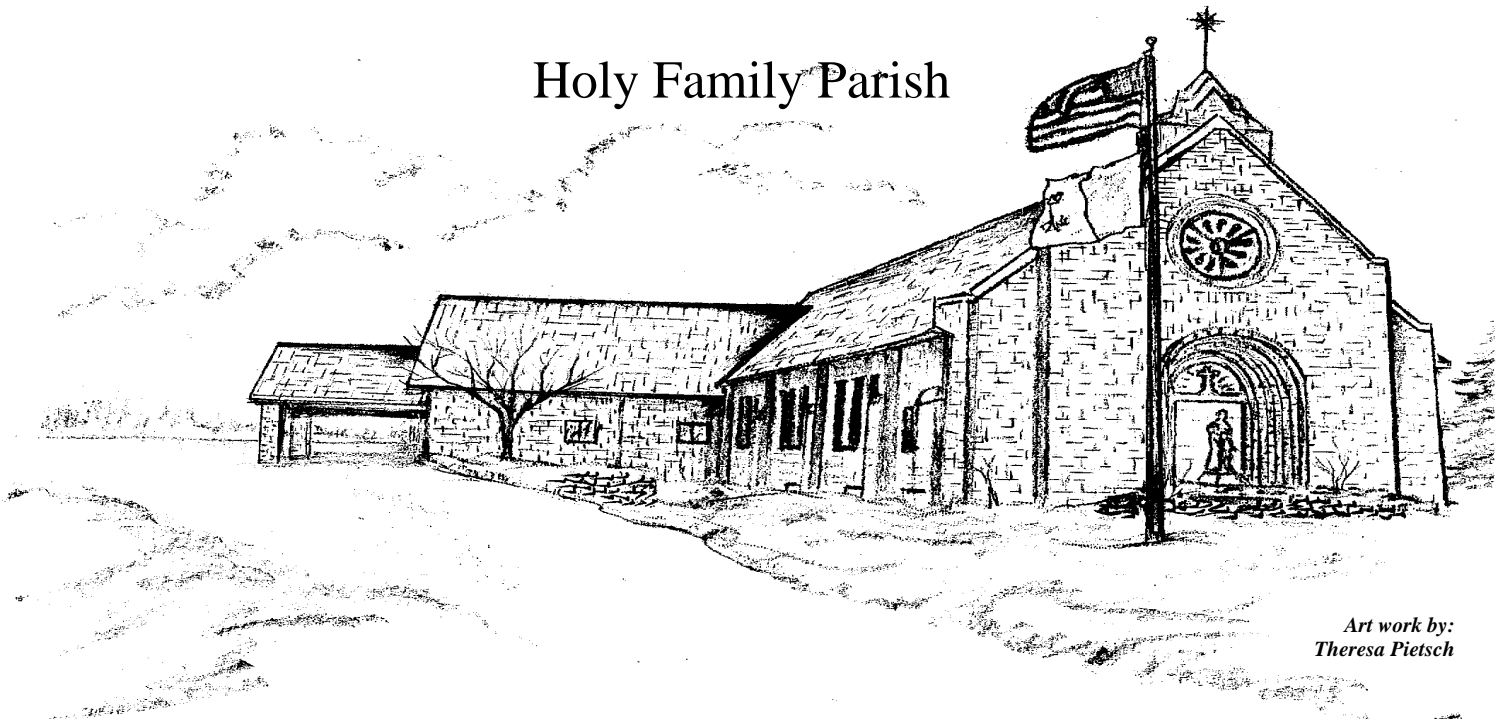

The Pastor's Mind's Eye

Learning from the Church in Germany

When I was stationed in Hanau, GERMANY I always thought that we could learn an important lesson from the Catholic Church in Germany. To begin, what is the case? Although it seems very uncouth and alien to us Americans, in Germany and many other European countries the State places a surcharge on each person's income tax, which is then given over to whichever religious organization the individual is registered as belonging to. In other words (to put it in Catholic terms), instead of leaving the amount that you will financially contribute to your parish up to you, you automatically pay a set amount to the government, which gives it to the Church. It's a religious tax. As I say, it sounds strange to us with our emphasis on separation of Church and State, but it is actually a very old practice, and all the major religions in Germany do it this way.
