It likewise provides the faithful with a tangible opportunity to not only empower the weak, defenseless, and voiceless, but also sustain those who suffer.

JUST A FEW REMINDERS FROM FR. FRANCIS:

Distribution of communion will take on some new features in our ongoing attempt to keep us all safe. It will also take more time. I will distribute communion myself. I ask that you approach for communion using the side aisles rather than the main aisle and that you help yourself to hand sanitizer if you wish as you pass the dispenser. Please allow six feet between communicants as you approach. Please take turns left side, right side, left side, right side and so on. Please return to your pew using the main aisle. I will pause to purify my hands using a high potency sanitizer after every few communicants. I will sanitize my hands after each person or household who receives communion on the tongue. You may receive either in the hand or on the tongue. Now, more than ever, it is important that, if you choose to receive communion in the hand, that you place one hand on top of the other and hold them out, slightly cupped, to reverently receive the host. By no means should grab at the host!

Bishop John has asked that, when attending Mass, all should wear a face mask while in the church except while receiving Holy Communion. We priests are instructed to wear a mask only while distributing communion, principally so that the words of the Mass can be understood. The readers may remove their masks while proclaiming the lessons and leading the psalm. When you enter the church you should be wearing a face mask and should immediately sanitize your hands at the stations provided. The church will have been sanitized before your arrival including a sanitizing preparation between the two Sunday Masses.

If you choose to wear gloves, be sure to remove them if and when you receive Holy Communion in the hand.

I will be hearing confessions, behind the screen only, and I ask that the penitent sanitize the screen and arm rest with a sanitizing wipe after receiving the absolution (There will be a carton of wipes on a stand in the confessional.).
