Just a little insight into next week's readings

ISAIAH 61: 1-2, 10-11 1 THESSALONIANS 5: 16-24 JOHN 1: 6-8, 19-28

We claim to be "the Body of Christ" and the "people of God." If we truly are the presence of Christ in the world it should be apparent from our sense of mission. Can any one of us say: "The spirit of the Lord God is upon me, because the Lord has anointed me; he has sent me to bring glad tidings to the lowly, to heal the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives and release to the prisoners, to announce a year of favor from the Lord and a day of vindication by our God?" Our lives are no longer our own. Our time, our talents, and our treasures have all been given to us for a purpose. The whole reason for our being must mirror the life of Christ. We are here to serve God and serve our neighbor. As church, we do that together. Our proclamation of the gospel is often carried out by our participation in the life of the institution. We cannot all be missionaries, but we can all participate in mission work through prayer and sacrifice. We cannot all labor among the poor, but we can all share our resources. We cannot all work among the captives or the brokenhearted, but we can all demonstrate the freedom of the children of God and lift up our own hearts to the Lord.

2nd Sunday of Advent

He is coming. In today's reading from Matthew, John the Baptist announces for all to hear the long-awaited coming of the Messiah. John the Baptist proclaimed a serious message of change and conversion. Indeed, he must have been a sight to behold draped in his penitential garb, nibbling on his locusts and honey. Anyone who heard him preaching must have taken notice, even if they didn't take heed. If nothing else, John the Baptist surely got people's attention. But will he get ours? True conversion reveals itself outwardly. When our hearts change, our actions do too. Charity replaces criticism. Forgiveness replaces anger. Service replaces selfishness. The catechism teaches us that the kingdom of heaven belongs to the poor and lowly; in other words, to those who have accepted it with humble hearts (CCC 544). This Advent, may we feel the urgency of John's words and get about the serious business of repentance.
