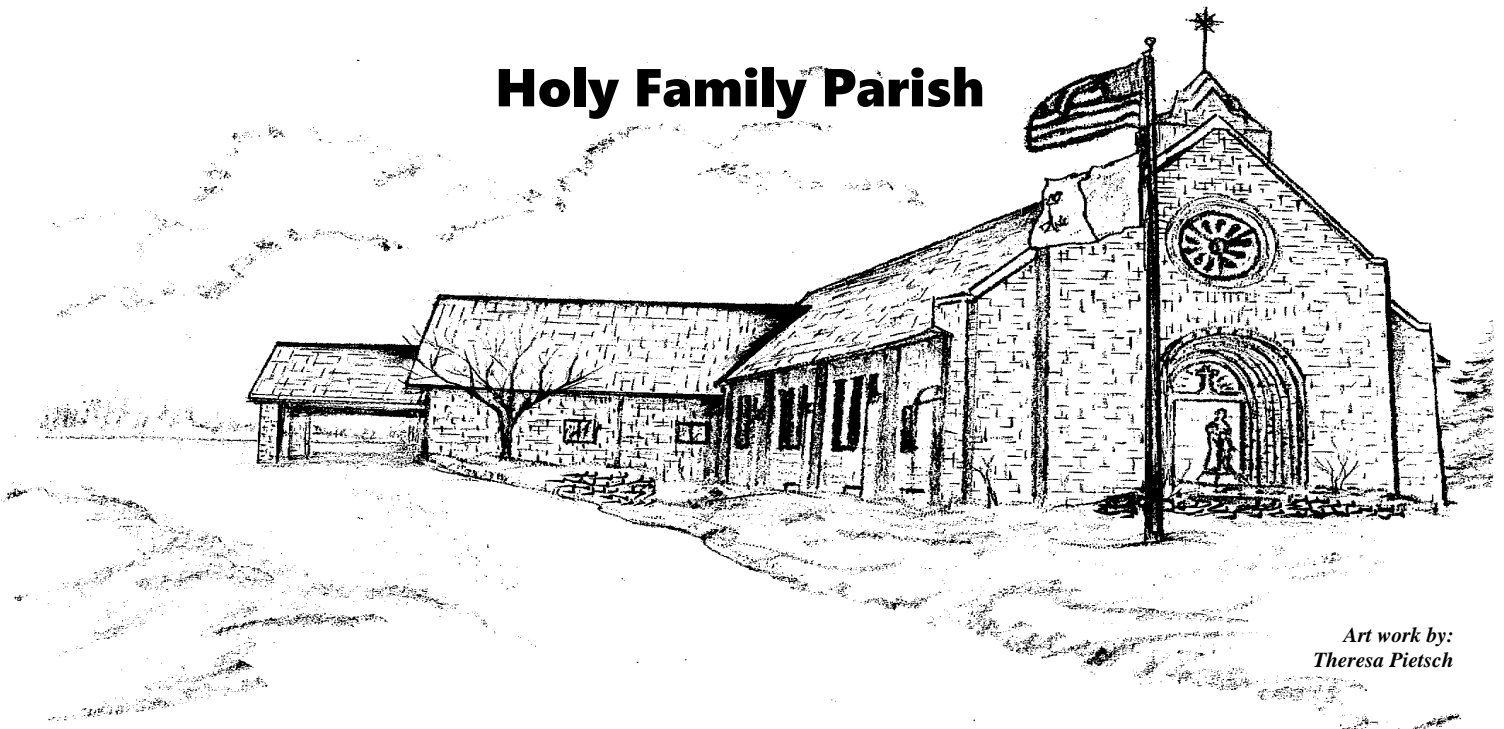

From the Desk of Fr. Francis

Three young men have approached me about organizing a Catholic Young Men's Group at Holy Family Church. The proposal is modest with a commitment for the summer months as the organizers include and hope especially to attract college and university students home for the summer months. This works out well for the use of our facility as they plan to meet on Thursday evenings beginning at 7:00 p.m. The idea seems sound and one that should be encouraged and welcomed. At the end of the summer we can take stock and if the group's activities recommend themselves as a year-round project, another evening will be explored. The three young men insist that "young" is a state of mind, not the accumulation of years; husbands and fathers and grandfathers as well as the elderly pastor are most welcome. Bring a cribbage board and/or your own non-alcoholic refreshment if you are so inclined.

The program for the evenings includes:

1. A talk by Father Francis about some matter of the Catholic Faith, apologetics or Christian Virtue. (± 20 minutes)
2. Some reading and study of Sacred Scripture or classic of Catholic literature. (± 20 minutes)
3. Socializing (*ad libitum*)



The next few Wednesday evenings at 6:00 p.m. have been set aside for new server training and veteran server review. After the servers have reviewed their duties or learned them anew, there will be similar review sessions for the readers and extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion. We will have another session this Wednesday, 30 May 2018, at 6:00 p.m. The review/training sessions will last between an hour and an hour and fifteen minutes.
