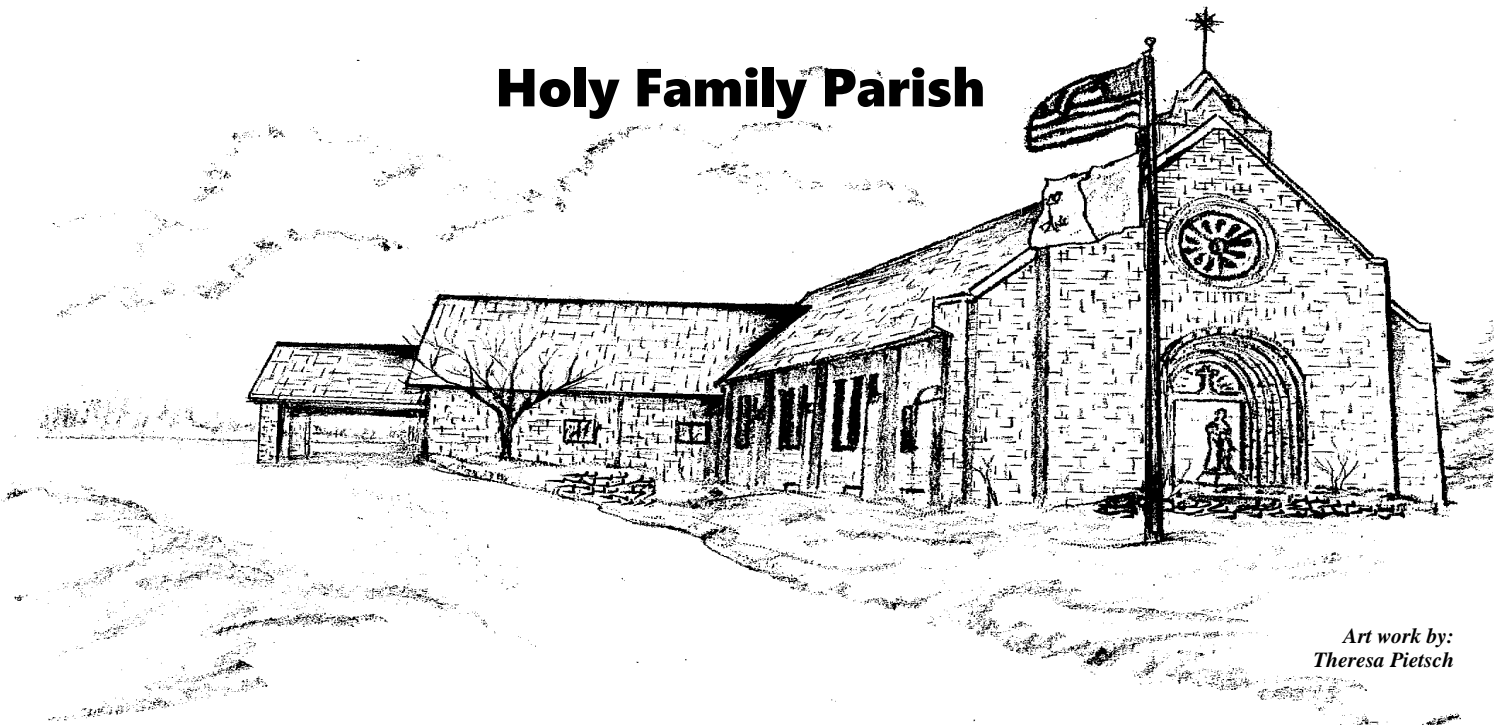

Our thoughts and prayers are with all those affected by the flooding in Houghton and Menominee counties. Parishioners are encouraged to pray and be generous with those agencies engaged in the relief effort. Among those is St. Ignatius Loyola Parish in Houghton (Holy Family, South Range). The parish, in partnership with St. Albert the Great in Houghton (St. Anne, Chassell) and Church of the Resurrection in Hancock (St. Francis, Dollar Bay), is working with local first responders, Meals on Wheels and other local agencies to provide relief. St. Joseph Parish in Lake Linden is planning on a second collection next weekend to help disaster relief in that area. Both Houghton and Menominee counties have been declared disaster areas by the governor, allowing for National Guard deployment to assist with road repairs and easier availability of state and national funds. A diocesan-wide collection is not scheduled. Those wishing to donate are encouraged to put their donation in a plain envelope mark “**U.P. Disaster Relief**” and place it in the collection basket here at Holy Family over the next two weekends. We will make sure it goes to the appropriate place.

GOOD NEWS

It is my privilege to announce the Good News of salvation on a daily basis here at Holy Family in Flat Rock. While not of the magnitude of that Good News, I do have some good news with regard to our ongoing “roof project.” Thanks to a substantial and anonymous donation, more pledges honored and a grant from the Community Foundation we are able to move forward with the original plan for the project, stone coated steel shingles over insulation board covering the whole roof. This is the work described in the original contract signed by my predecessor, Father Longbucco, and it is good that we are able to honor that contract. I am grateful, however, for the cooperation and flexibility of the contractor, especially during the months that it looked as though we would not be able to honor the contract. The work may begin as early as this July.
