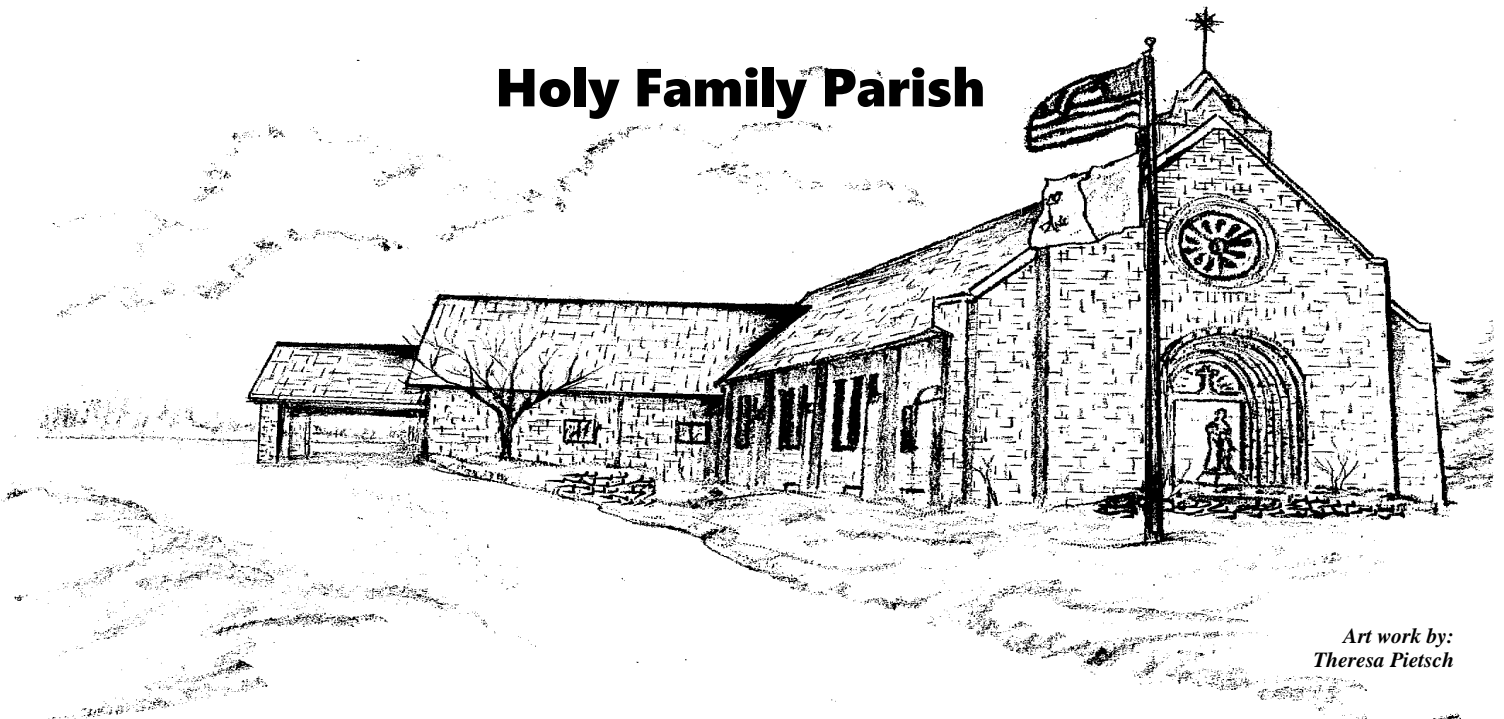

While not of the magnitude of that Good News, I do have some good news with regard to our ongoing “roof project.” Thanks to a substantial and anonymous donation, more pledges honored and a grant from the Community Foundation we are able to move forward with the original plan for the project, stone coated steel shingles over insulation board covering the whole roof. This is the work described in the original contract signed by my predecessor, Father Longbucco, and it is good that we are able to honor that contract. I am grateful, however, for the cooperation and flexibility of the contractor, especially during the months that it looked as though we would not be able to honor the contract. The work may begin as early as this July.
