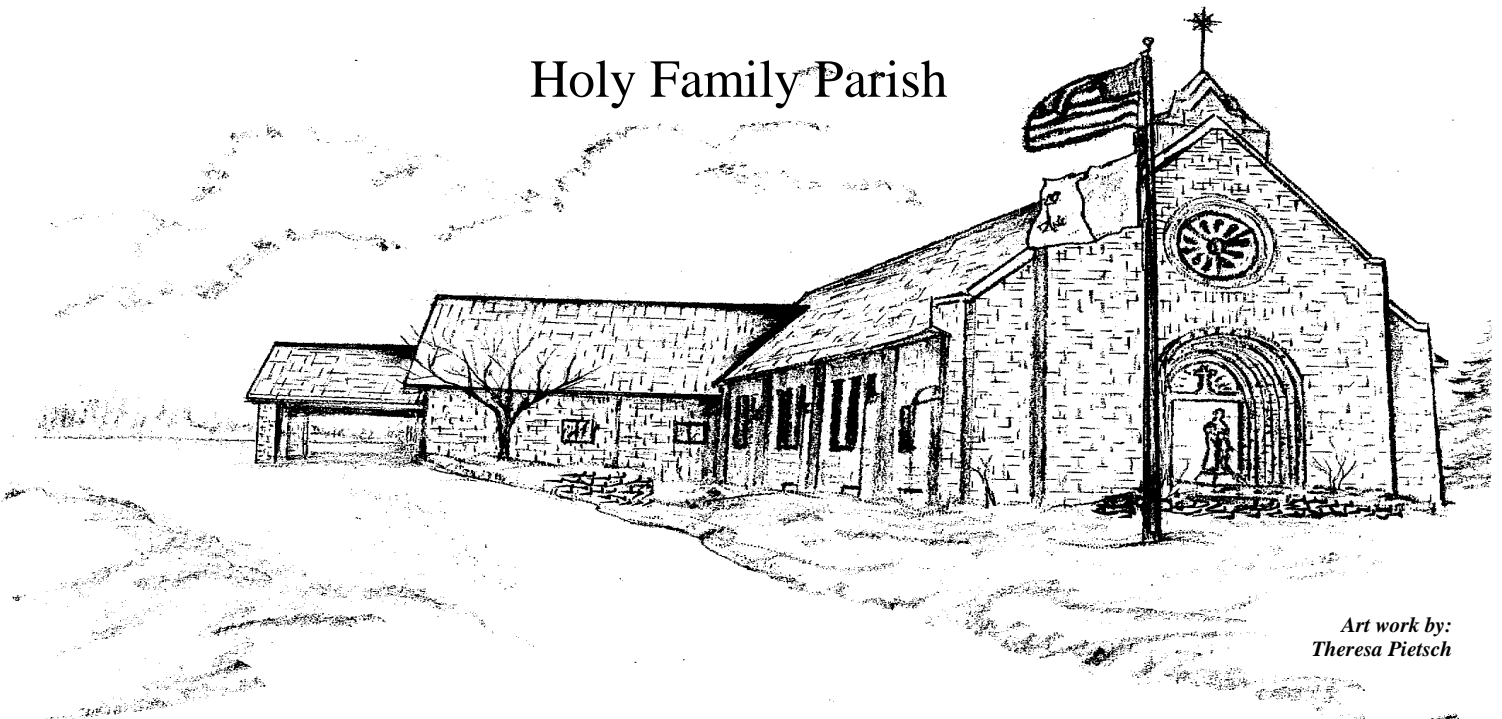

## The Pastor's Mind's Eye

### 7<sup>th</sup> Spiritual Work of Mercy – Prayer for the Living and the Dead

Part III

This is the fundamental truth that prayer underscores: we are instruments of *God's* peace. It is God, not us, who is the source of mercy. One wise spiritual writer wrote centuries ago that if we make prayer the center of our lives, we will discover the difference between doing great things for God and God doing great things through us. Prayer is real in its effects and it has the added advantage of being hidden: this is the “stealth” work of mercy, because it is only God who knows about our prayer. Christ assures us that the Father who sees in secret will reward us.

The saints are our great models for this work of mercy, especially Mary, the Mother of God. At the wedding feast of Cana she interceded with her Son for the couple who were about to be embarrassed in front of their guests.

Mary asked with absolute trust, not telling her Son what to do, but simply bringing the matter to his attention. How often we bring to God both the problem and the best solution to it! And even when it seemed that her Son would not act, Mary trusted him. Her final recorded words in Scripture are the simple directive for us to carry out this work of mercy, and all works of mercy: “Do whatever he tells you” (Jn 2:5).

## **Sumus Missiles Deum**

Hello everyone! It's been a while since I've last written. These past couple months have been super busy and full of adventures. After the end of the school year at the beginning of May, I was sent with the rest of my class down to Central America for six weeks to study Spanish and culture for four weeks and to do mission work for two weeks. We were in Antigua Guatemala studying Spanish. Each of us was assigned an instructor who taught us one on one. Monday through Friday we would meet for five hours a day and we would get plenty of homework assigned for the next day. At the end of every day my brain felt like it was mush! In our free time we explored the city and went on various excursions such as climbing a volcano and visiting a coffee farm/cultural museum. We stayed at a very beautiful convent while we were in Antigua where the sisters made very sure that we were speaking to each other in Spanish. After our four weeks in Antigua, we traveled to Benque Belize to live with a SOLT (Society of Our Lady of the Most Holy Trinity) and help them with their community. We did everything from painting a church and roofing a house to teaching children about the Faith and praying with people. Overall the entire trip was an amazing and invaluable experience. By learning a foreign culture, I realize that I actually understand my own culture in a more profound and deeper way than before. I already see that it's helping me to minister to our culture and how to be more pastoral. I am so thankful that I was given the opportunity to go on this trip. After returning home about four weeks ago I was home for a short time and now I am stationed at St. Paul the Apostle Parish in Calumet with Fr. Abraham Mupparathara until August 8<sup>th</sup> to get a good taste of parish life. So far the experience has been wonderful and I've learned so much. I miss you all and it will be good to see you when I get back home for a short time before school starts. Please continue to pray for me and know that I pray for this parish every day.
