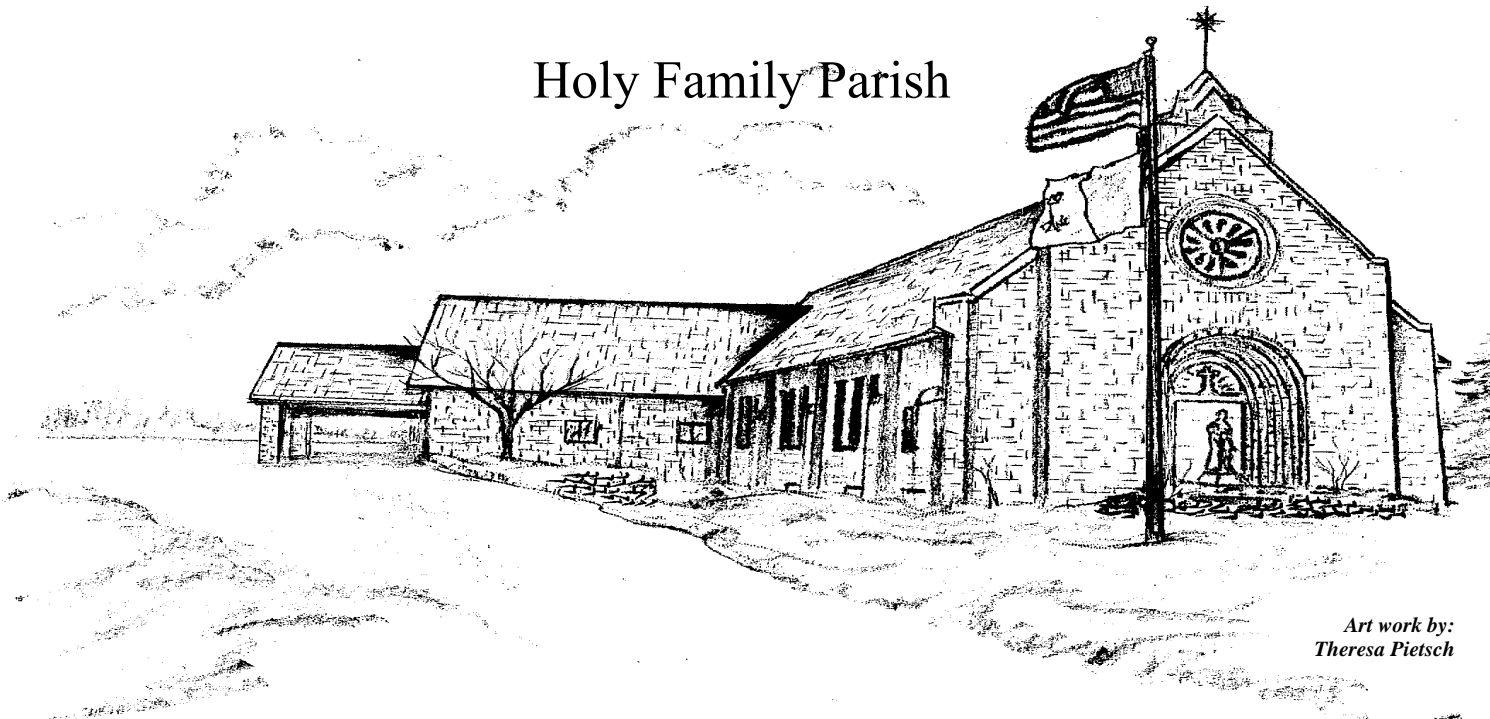

The Pastor’s Mind’s Eye

Called to care for those with weak voices.

Pope Francis, throughout his time in the United States called all citizens and especially Catholics to be mindful of those with “weak voices.” We must continue to defend the rights of the unborn but we must, with the same energy, care for the widow and all the elderly whose voices have grown weak with age.

This morning as I was praying the Divine Office the reading chosen for today’s Office of Readings was from the Apostle Paul to his disciple Timothy. Chapter 5 verses 3-25: *“Make the following rules about widows, so that no one may incur blame. If anyone does not provide for his own relatives and especially for members of his immediate family, he has denied the faith; he is worse than an unbeliever.”*

These are powerful words, that are times and true, which must be heeded if we are to acquire salvation.

Also a thank you to all the ministers who served at Mass the last two weeks and made it easier for Fr. Grambow to help out.
