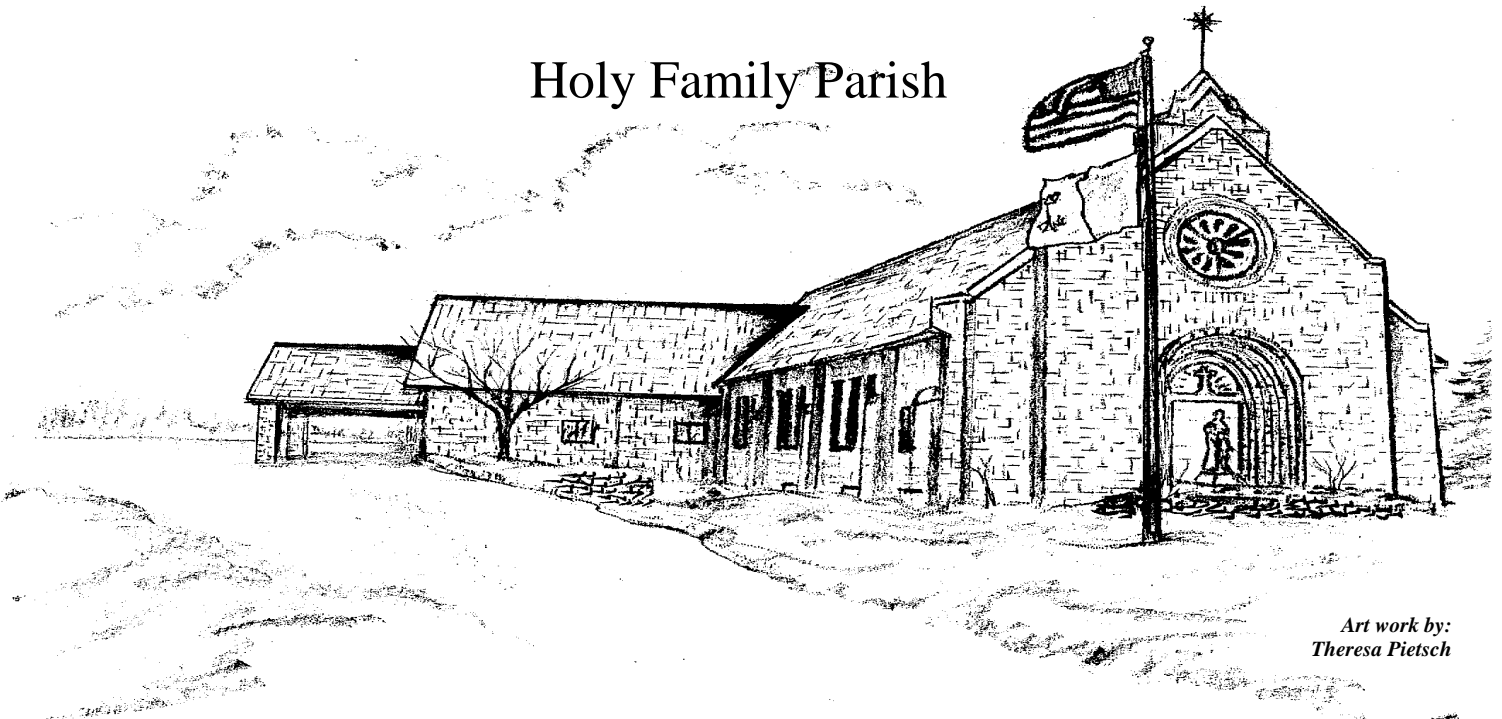

**The Pastor’s Mind’s Eye**

There is a story told that a student asked that famous anthropologist Dr. Margaret Mead, “What is the earliest sign of civilization in any given culture?” Dr. Mead answer: “A healed femur” (the big leg bone between the hip and the knee). It is said that the student was expecting an answer that involved, a tool, a weapon or a piece of pottery. According many scientists a healed femur shows that someone took care of the injured person. Someone else had to step in to carry out the work of hunting and gathering until the individual’s fractured leg healed. For, the anthropologist, Dr. Margaret Mead the first sign of civilization was *the evidence of compassion*.
