From your pastor

The Paschal Triduum

Please see the bulletin insert regarding the Paschal Triduum in the bulletin this weekend.

The Easter Vigil is the most solemn celebration of the Church Year. This year the rites will include the baptism, confirmation and first communion of Gunnar LaMarche. Our celebration of the Vigil, though a lengthy liturgy is a vestige of the original. As with any true vigil, the idea was to keep watch through the night. It has been my privilege to watch through the whole night twice. The service began at night fall and the readings were read on the hour, each with its own homily throughout the night with the Gloria sung and the remainder of the Mass offered just before dawn. Folks wandered in and out throughout the night while the young people of the parish kept watch, two by two throughout the night. Most of the parish gathered for the Gloria and the remainder of the Mass in the cold pre-dawn of Easter Morning. I was much younger then.

Compared to that the hours of the Easter Vigil next Saturday is a short prayer. The Offertory Prayers struck me on Ash Wednesday, especially “that, through the works of penance and charity, we may turn away from harmful pleasures and, cleansed from our sins, may become worthy to celebrate devoutly the Passion of your Son.” Perhaps, I thought, so few attend the Easter Vigil because they feel unworthy to celebrate devoutly the Passion of the Son of God. Of course none of us is really worthy, depending absolutely on the grace of God for any semblance of worthiness. Whether your Lent has been good, mediocre or poor, like Christ on the way top Calvary when he fell three times, pick yourselves up and come to church to pray, on Holy Thursday, on Good Friday, and for the Easter Vigil. And do all with hearts filled with gratitude for so great a Redeemer!

You will notice that the time for the Good Friday Service, this year as last year, is later than the time customarily set for this service. The change is dictated by the rubrics for the feast which leave little doubt as to scheduling:

“On the afternoon of this day, about three o’clock (unless a later hour is chosen for a pastoral reason), there takes place the celebration of the Lord’s Passion consisting of three parts, namely, the Liturgy of the Word, the Adoration of the Cross, and Holy Communion.

In the United States, if the size or nature of a parish or other community indicates the pastoral need for an additional liturgical service, The Diocesan Bishop may permit the service to be repeated later. This liturgy by its very nature may not, however, be celebrated in the absence of a Priest.

Similarly, for Holy Saturday and the Easter Vigil:

The entire celebration of the Easter Vigil must take place during the night, so that it begins after nightfall and ends before daybreak on the Sunday.

The Mass of Vigil, even if it is celebrated before midnight, is a paschal Mass of the Sunday of Resurrection.

Anyone who participates in the Mass of the night may receive communion again at Mass during the day.
