OF TIMES AND FEASTS

You will notice that the time for the Good Friday Service is later than the time customarily set for this service. The change is dictated by the rubrics for the feast which leave little doubt as to scheduling:

"On the afternoon of this day, about three o'clock (unless a later hour is chosen for a pastoral reason), there takes place the celebration of the Lord's Passion consisting of three parts, namely, the Liturgy of the Word, the Adoration of the Cross, and Holy Communion.

In the United States, if the size or nature of a parish or other community indicates the pastoral need for an additional liturgical service, The Diocesan Bishop may permit the service to be repeated later. This liturgy by its very nature may not, however, be celebrated in the absence of a Priest.

Similarly, for Holy Saturday and the Easter Vigil:

The entire celebration of the Easter Vigil must take place during the night, so that it begins after nightfall and ends before daybreak on the Sunday.

The Mass of Vigil, even if it is celebrated before midnight, is a paschal Mass of the Sunday of Resurrection. Anyone who participates in the Mass of the night may receive communion again at Mass during the day.
