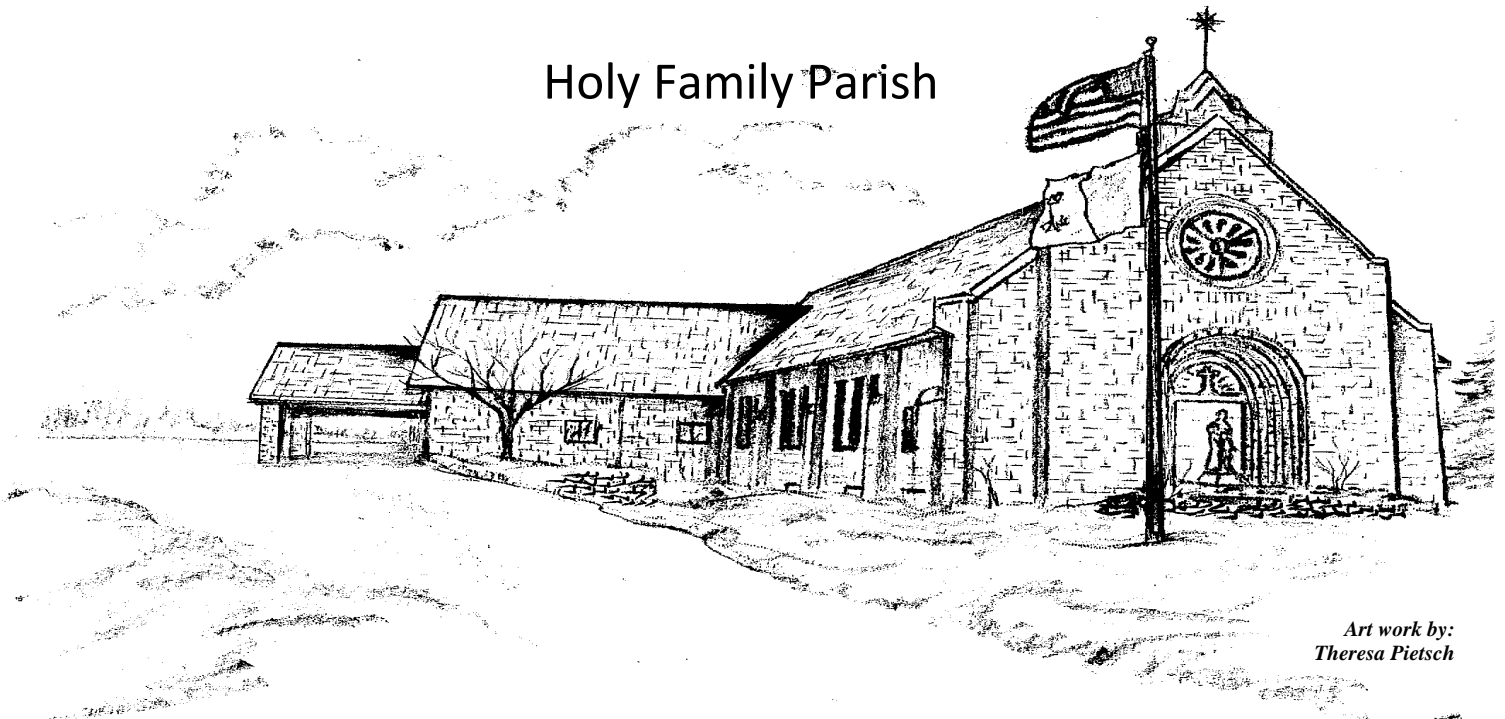

ST. JOSEPH ASSOCIATION (GOOD SHEPHERD SUNDAY COLLECTION)

Retired priests of the Diocese of Marquette receive health and automobile insurance and a monthly pension from the St. Joseph Association, the diocesan priest retirement fund. Diocesan priests live independently during their retirement, and they use their pension for basic needs, such as food, housing and transportation. Parish assessments, plus growth in the St. Joseph Association, have fallen short of what is needed to provide necessary benefits to our retired priests.

Our parish will participate in a special collection on April 28th – 29th help “bridge the gap.” It is essential that we ensure adequate retirement and health coverage in the years ahead for our priests.

Two items came up during the recent meetings of the parish finance and pastoral councils. I was asked to write something about adult faith formation and about the status of the roof project.

Adult Faith Formation

Holy Family Church — Flat Rock

A group of parishioners meets with me in Monsignor Matt Hall of Holy Family Church in Flat Rock on most Monday evenings to consider the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* for an hour or so beginning at 7:00 p.m. These Monday evenings are sometimes intruded upon by other parish meetings or events such as Holy Week.

We simply read and discuss the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*. I recognize that we all lead busy lives so there is no “homework,” nothing to read in preparation for the sessions, and no level of expert knowledge required. We simply read through the paragraphs of the catechism, I comment on some of them and attempt to answer any questions that arise.

You will learn to talk “Catholic” and be exposed to a whole new and somewhat specialized vocabulary, e.g. “Pastors of Churches” is code for bishops. The upper case letter “P” in the word pastor is generally an indication of a bishop. A capital “P” Pastor is a bishop. So I am the pastor of Holy Family Church in Flat Rock and Bishop John Doerfler is the Pastor of Marquette (The Diocese of).

The catechism is organized according to the tenets of the Apostles Creed and Niceno–Constantinopolitan Creed, the Ten Commandments, the seven sacraments and the “Our Father.” There is, of course, additional introductory and descriptive material as well. I have taught the sections on prayer and the liturgy and sacraments in the college level courses I taught at the seminary some years ago.

There is no guarantee that you will learn something. For my part, I learn something new every time I read through the catechism, and I have been reading it through for most of the last twenty-four years.

Bishop John Doerfler will be here at the parish for the weekend on May fifth and sixth. He will offer the First Communion Mass at 4:00 p.m. on Saturday. At the 10:00 a.m. Mass he will receive my “Profession of Faith” and “Oath of Fidelity” marking me as fit for the care of souls entrusted to pastors of churches (lower case “p” and “c”). Actually “Pastors of Churches” (bishops) are also required to make a “Profession of Faith” and “Oath of Fidelity” before they take office. I witnessed Bishop Doerfler’s profession and oath back in 2013, before he was ordained a bishop and became our own bishop.

NEW ROOFS

With regard to our roof project, I will be meeting soon with the buildings and grounds committee to discuss roofing our buildings with more conventional materials as we have been unable to raise sufficient funds for the installation of the proposed metal roof. Those who have made a pledge and/or a contribution for this project will be hearing from me soon regarding your will with regard to the monies we have already collected. I am hopeful that we will have new roofs in place before the snow flies in September or October.
