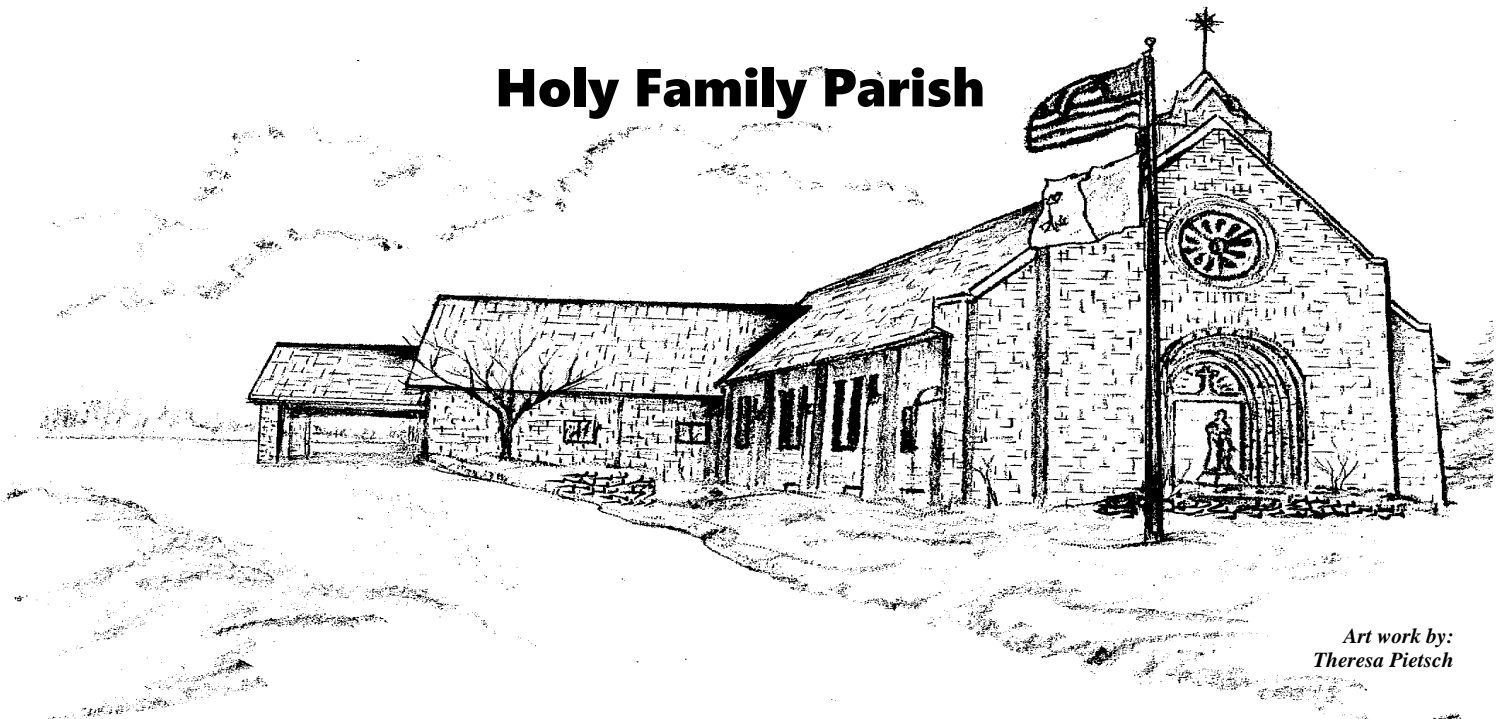

PRAYER SHAWL MINISTRY
