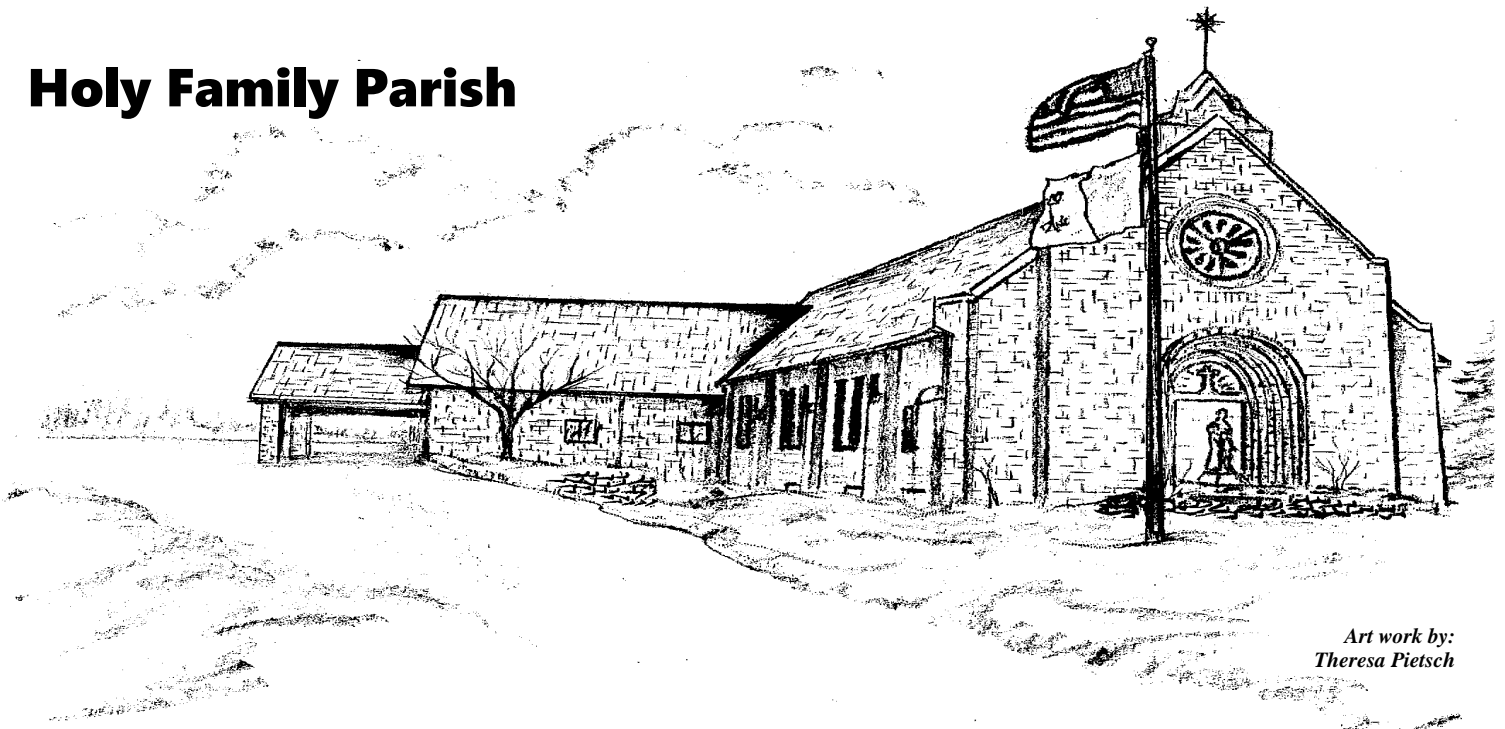

MARIAN HOLY HOUR

The Carmelite Nuns invite you to their annual Marian Holy Hour in honor of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel to be held at the Monastery Chapel from 7:00 to 8:00 p.m. on July 14th, 15th and 16th. The Holy Hour each evening will include Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament, a Reflection on Our Lady, the Rosary and a Litany. Father Vinko Mamic, O.C.D., a Discalced Carmelite priest from Croatia who will be here in the United States this summer visiting different Carmels, will conduct this year's Triduum (three days of Marian Holy Hour). If you wish to come a little earlier, the Nuns will be singing some Eucharistic and Marian hymns at around 6:50 p.m. each evening.

Scapulars, rosaries, leaflets, CD's and holy cards will be available for the taking. Enrollment in the Brown Scapular will be offered on the evening of the 16th for anyone who wishes to be enrolled --- which means acceptance of Mary as Mother. Wearing the Scapular is a sign of belonging to Mary, whom we desire to imitate and who will lead us to Jesus. God bless you!
