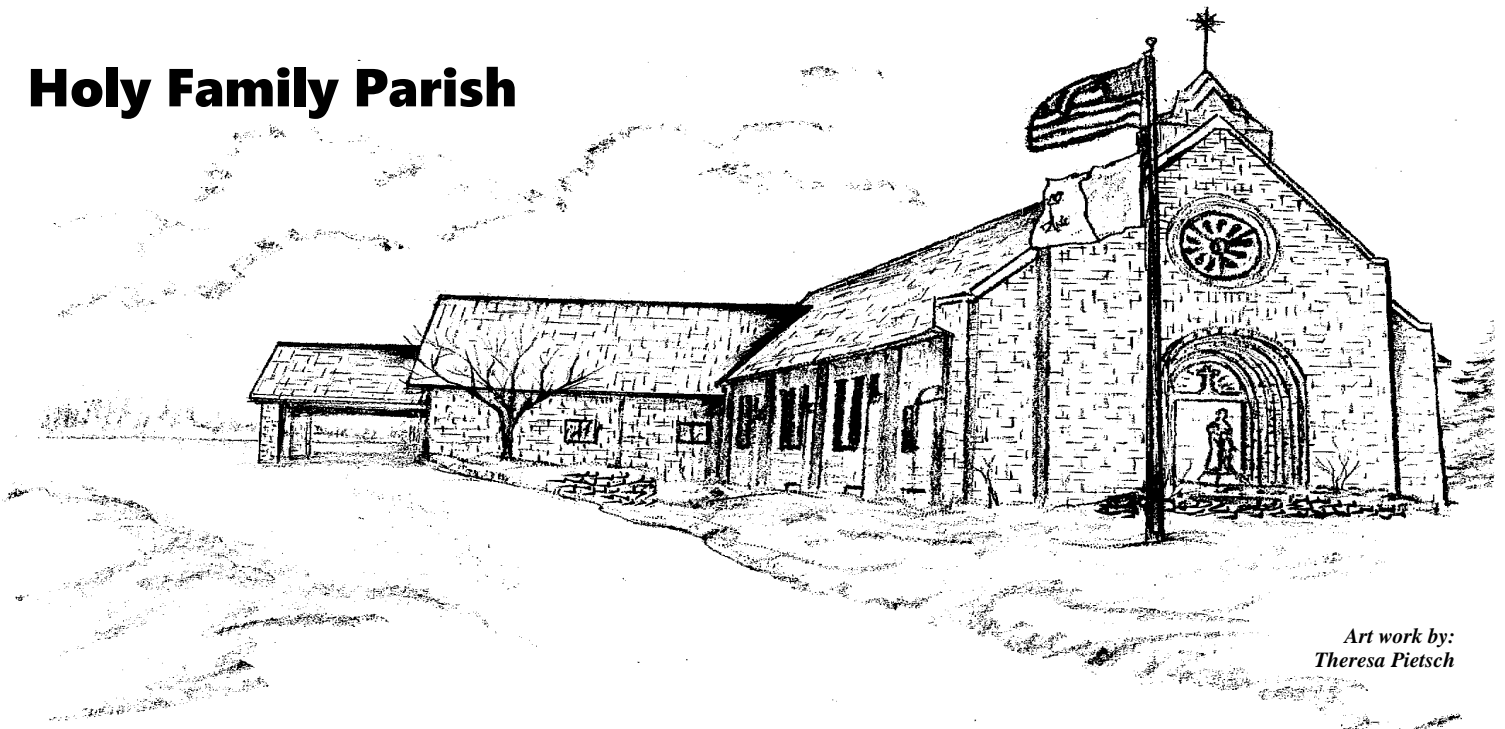

In the gospel passage for today Saint Luke presents us with a response of Jesus to a request from the apostles for a lesson in praying. Forgiveness lies at the heart of the lesson.

The Catechism of Pope Saint Pius V underscores the seriousness of the matter:

So rigorously does God exact from us forgetfulness of injuries and mutual affection and love, that he rejects and despises the gifts and sacrifices of those who are not reconciled to one another (*Saint Pius V Catechism*, 4, 14, 16).

Saint Teresa of Avila takes up the same matter:

This, sisters, is something which we should consider carefully; it is such a serious and important matter that God should pardon us our sins, which have merited eternal fire, that we must pardon all trifling things which have been done to us. As I have so few, Lord, even of these trifling things to offer thee, thy pardoning of me must be a free gift; there is abundant scope here for thy mercy. Blessed be thou, who endures one who is so poor (*Saint Teresa of Avila, Way of Perfection*, chapter 36).
