COMFORT THE AFFLICTED – Part 2

As with other works of mercy, this one calls for delicacy. People grieve in different ways, so there is no simple formula for giving comfort. One very practical suggestion is, when a loved one experiences some kind of shock or loss, turn a few pages in your calendar and jot a note to get in touch in a month or so to see how they are doing.

There is often a flurry of sympathy when tragedy strikes, but after a few weeks the afflicted person finds that people have moved on to other concerns. Sorrows don’t space themselves out, and it is understandable that subsequent events distract people. If we make a note to get in touch from time to time, our small doses of sympathy will be more effective – like those “time release” capsules that provide medicine over a period of time.

Our comfort can take practical forms, too. Especially in the aftermath of a death or some other catastrophic event, the suffering person not only has to deal with their grief, but there may be concerns that now have become their responsibility – taking care of business, managing the house, looking after children. An occasional helping hand can bring great comfort.

I personally want to thank all of the 4:00 o’clock Mass regulars for switching to another Mass for our First Communion kids. Fr. John
