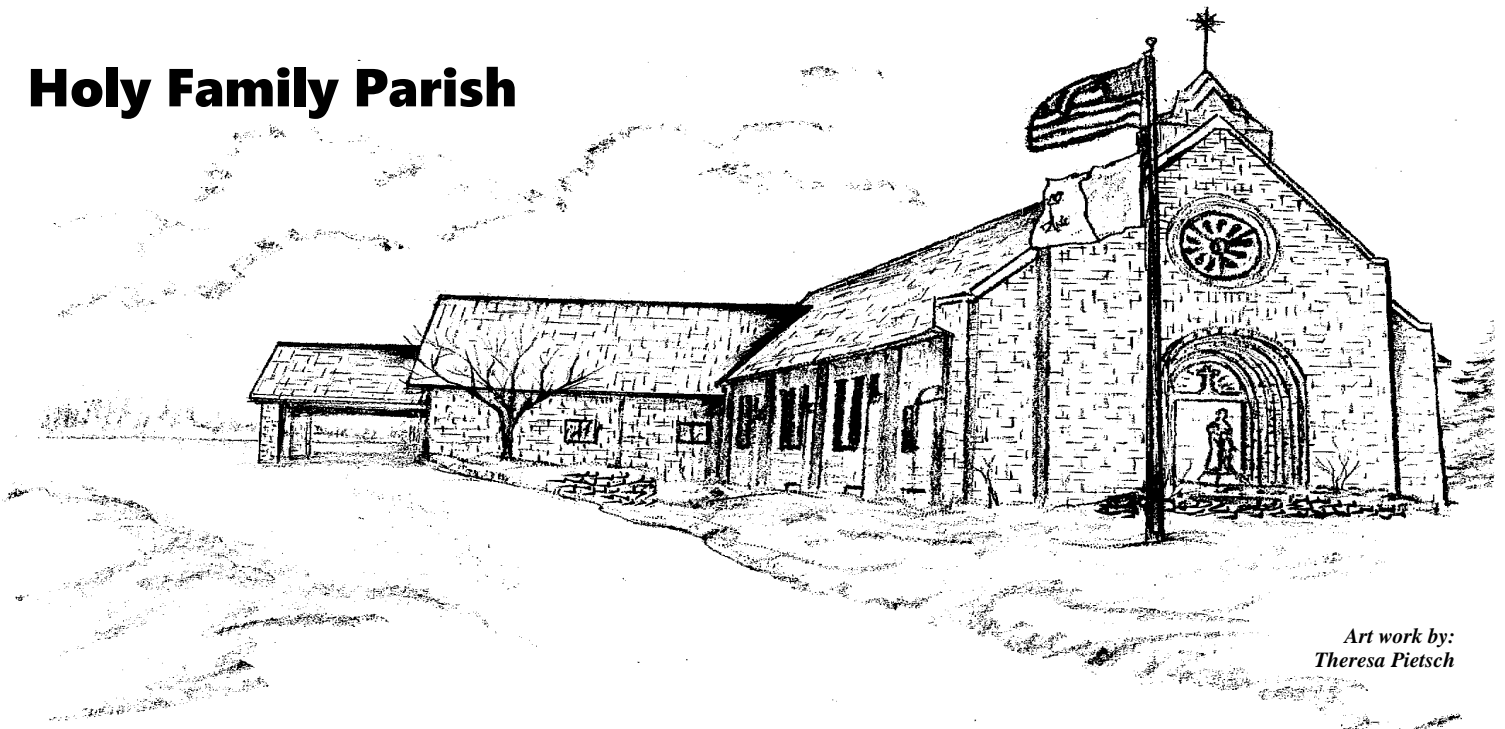

From your pastor

Last week’s consideration of “Thanksgiving and the Holy Eucharist” reminded me that a review of the norms for receiving Holy Communion might be in order in this space. When you are before the Blessed Sacrament, a bow of the head, reverencing the Blessed Sacrament before reception is required. Should you wish to receive Holy Communion on the tongue, you are to respond to the proclamation, “The Body of Christ,” by saying, “Amen.” Then open your mouth and extend your tongue. Should you wish to receive Holy Communion in the hand, you are to cup your two hands and place one on top of the other and extend them to the priest, deacon or extraordinary minister of Holy Communion; you are to respond to the proclamation, “The Body of Christ,” by saying, “Amen.” Then, when the host is placed in the cup of the top hand, you are to step aside and using the bottom hand, reverently place the sacred host into your mouth. One must never take or snatch the host from the hand of the person distributing Holy Communion. One may not receive Holy Communion in the hand while wearing gloves or with hands half covered by shirt sleeves. There should be nothing else in or on your hand (dirt, your girlfriends telephone number, the answers to a test, etc.) when you receive the sacred host into your hand.

In an audience with young people in 1979 (I was still young myself then; still under thirty.) Pope Saint John Paul II considered the admonition at the beginning of the gospel passage proclaimed this Sunday, i.e. praying always without losing heart:

It must be humbly and realistically recognized that we are poor creatures, confused in ideas, tempted by evil, frail and weak, in continual need of inner strength and consolation. Prayer gives the strength for great ideals, to maintain faith, charity, purity and generosity. Prayer gives the courage to emerge from indifference and guilt, if unfortunately one has yielded to temptation and weakness. Prayer gives light to see and consider the events of one’s own life and of history in the salvific perspective of God and eternity. Therefore, do not stop praying! Let not a day pass without your having prayed a little! Prayer is a duty, but it is also a great joy, because it is a dialogue with God through Jesus Christ! Every Sunday, Holy Mass: if it is possible for you, sometimes during the week. Every day, morning and evening prayers, and at the most suitable moments!
