The Pastor's Mind's Eye

Bear Wrongs Patiently - Part 1

"For to this you have been called, because Christ suffered for you, leaving you an example, that you should follow in his steps. He committed no sin; no guile was found on his lips. When he was reviled, he did not revile in return; when he suffered, he did not threaten; but he trusted to him who judges justly" (1 Pt 2:21-23). We know that Jesus stated quite categorically that if we want to be his disciples we must take up our cross every day and follow him (Lk 9:23). This work of mercy spells out one way to do this.

At the outset we should be clear what this work of mercy does not mean: that we should continue to live in an abusive situation where we or those we love are being harmed. At the heart of the Gospel is the dignity of every human being, made in the image and likeness of God; we are commanded to love our neighbor as ourselves, not at the expense of ourselves.



The Return of Communion under both species

We have now brought back the Precious Blood. That means we are in need of nine Eucharistic ministers every weekend with a list of 29 (which we lose some to the summer and winter seasons). Some only can serve at a certain Mass so that means scheduling gets to be a little hectic. Please bear with us. There are times that we need to split up a couple for a Mass, or schedule ministers closer together. In order for us to maintain the precious blood we need a minimum of six more Eucharistic Ministers. Fr. John will have a training once we get the six ministers and that training will be for all OLD AND NEW.
