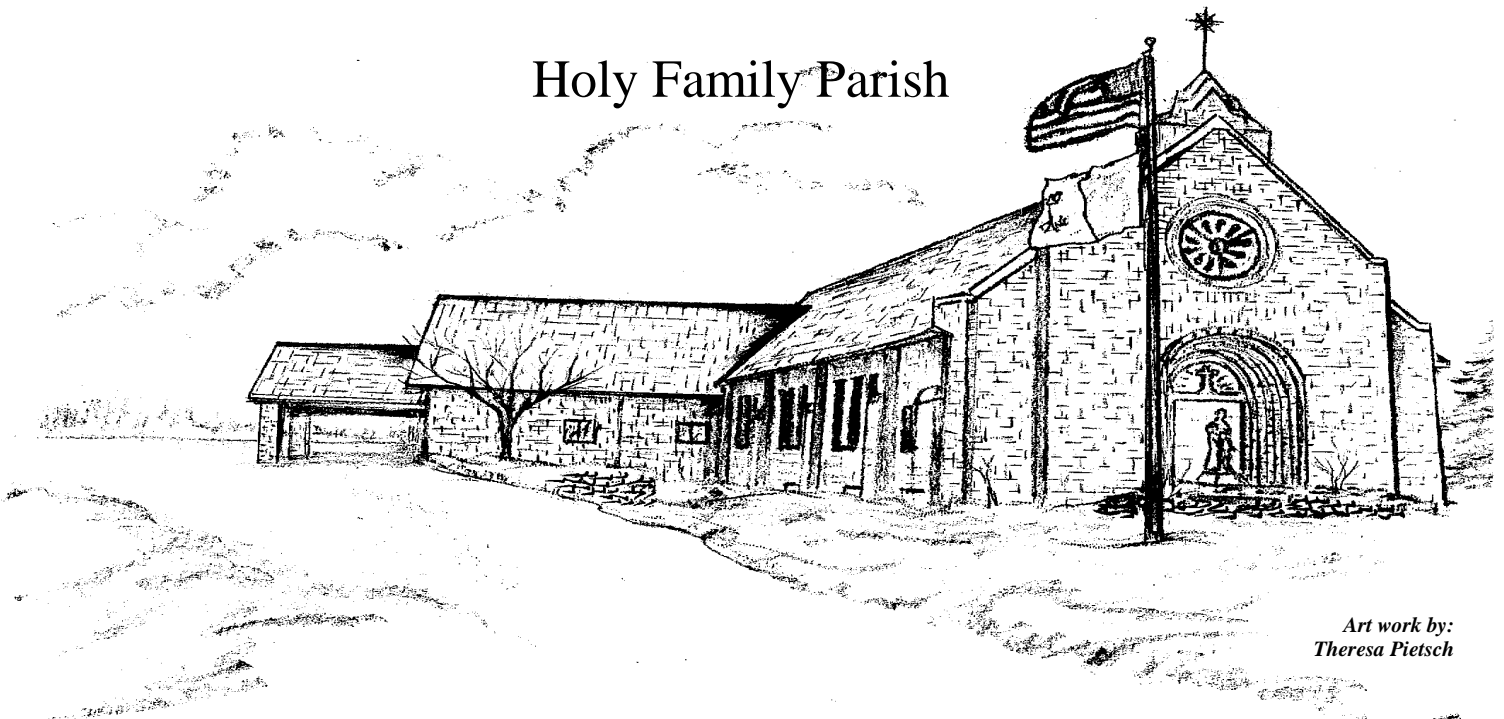

or by appointment

Sacrament of Marriage

Notice of six months is required

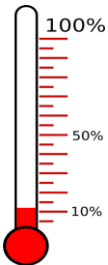
