CATECHETICAL CORNER THE MASS

The Gloria (Cont.)

"Lord Jesus Christ, only Begotten Son,
Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father,
You take away the sins of the world,
Have mercy on us;
You take away the sins of the world,
Receive our prayer;
You are seated at the right hand of the Father, have mercy on us."

In the second part of the Gloria Jesus is addressed as <u>'Only Begotten Son and Son of the Father</u>, which recall various New Testament texts that point to Jesus' divine Sonship (e.g. John5:17-18; 10:f30-38). John begins his gospel with a beautiful poetic reflection on the eternal **Word** who is God, who was with the Father in the beginning and through whom all things were made (Jn1:1-4). At the climax of this reflection, John astonishingly announces that this divine, eternal *Word* "became flesh and dwelt among us" (1:14). Thus when we address Jesus as the 'only Begotten Son' in the Gloria we recognize not merely as a teacher or prophet sent from God, but as divine Son, the eternal Word.

In this section of Gloria we see Jesus is also addressed as the 'Lamb of God' which recalls his redemptive mission. By addressing Jesus with this title in the Gloria we thus join the heavenly worship of the Lamb as revealed in the book of Revelation. He is the Lamb who takes away the sins of the world which John the Baptist saw in Jesus. The phrase, 'you are seated at the right hand of the Father' leads us to praise Jesus in the unique position of authority, he now possesses in Heaven. In this section the whole mission of Jesus is summed up. We move from Son's Incarnation to his paschal mystery to his enthronement in Heaven.

The last part of Gloria is:-

"For you alone are the Holy one, You alone are the Lord; you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the Glory of God the Father – Amen"

Here Jesus is given three Biblical titles: *the Holy one, the Lord, and the Most High*. Calling Jesus 'the Most High' recalls the Biblical title for God as the Supreme Being over all other 'gods.' Similarly, the Old Testament commonly calls God 'the Holy One of Israel.' Perhaps the remarkable title is 'you alone are the Lord.' Lord in the Bible is the title for God. The Gloria concludes with mention of the Third Person of the Trinity: the Holy Spirit, in Glory of God the Father.' In short the Gloria praises the Trinitarian God.

LENTEN DVD PRESENTATION

THE PASSION OF CHRIST; Edward Sri

After the soup supper on every Tuesday, we will be watching the DVD presented by Edward Sri, a renowned speaker who goes through the entire Passion of Jesus starting from Gethsemane to the Mount of Calvary. He speaks from every spot in Palestine wherever Jesus walked during his Passion. Every step of the way, Old Testament prophecies, messianic expectations, biblical symbolism, and historical context shed light on the mystery of Christ's suffering and death. Each session lasts only half hour and it is very interesting and enriching. Once we start listening to it our attention will never wander away, till it is over. Kindly consider attending it and you will enjoy it, no doubt.
