

THE MASS

Eucharistic Prayer (Cont.)

The Doxology and the Great Amen: The literal meaning of Doxology means expression of praise to God and the Holy Trinity, especially a short hymn sung as part of a Christian worship service. The word doxology comes from the Greek doxa, ("glory, splendor, grandeur") and logos, ("word" or "speaking"). The Eucharistic Prayer culminates with an expression of praise and glory. The priest sings, "Through him, and with him, and in him, O God Almighty Father, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honor is yours, forever and ever." Then the people respond with 'Great Amen.' These words have roots in the Scripture. They come part of St. Paul's letter to the Romans, "For from him and through him and to him are all things. To him, be glory forever. Amen" (Rom 11:36). St. Paul also refers to "the unity of the Spirit" in Eph 4:3.

Communion Rite: Now it is time for the final preparations. The bread and wine have been consecrated. The words of Institution have been spoken. Our Lord is now truly present before us. In just a moment we will receive the Body and Blood of Jesus. As part of the Communion Rite the priest invites the people to recite the 'Our Father' and followed by that the exchange of peace. Then you will notice while the congregation sing or say the Angus Dei or **Lamb of God...** the priest says some prayers silently and break the Consecrated Host and drop a piece in the precious Blood. We should know why he does the same. According to the general instruction of the Roman Missal, first of all it is Christ's gesture of breaking bread at the Last Supper, which gave the entire Eucharistic Action its name in apostolic times, Breaking the Bread, signifies that the many faithful are made one body (1 Cor. 10:17) by receiving Communion from the one Bread of Life which is Christ, who died and rose for the salvation of the world. The fraction or breaking of bread is begun after the sign of peace and is carried out

with proper reverence, though it should not be unnecessarily prolonged. This rite is reserved to the priest. The priest breaks the Bread and puts a piece of the Host into the chalice to signify the unity of the Body and Blood of the Lord in the work of salvation, namely, of the living and glorious Body of Jesus Christ.

The Lord's Prayer: The Lord's Prayer was taught by Jesus in the gospels of Mt. 6: 9-13; Lk 11: 1-4 and has been used in the Mass throughout the centuries. For some of us, this might be a routine prayer that we learned from childhood and simply repeat the same on every Sunday. Yet it should not be taken for granted. Before we approach the Lord's Prayer, the priest notes what a privilege it is for us to be able to talk to God in this way. He says, "At the Savior's command and formed by divine teaching we dare to say.."

A New Kind of Peace: After the 'Our Father' the priest continues, "Deliver us Lord we pray from every evil graciously grant peace in our day..." Here we arrive at a prayer that elaborates on the last petition of the Lord's Prayer. "And deliver us from every evil..." the priest picks up from the last part of the prayer, the "Our Father." The peace envisioned here is more than an absence of war or hostility in the world. The Biblical understanding of peace (Shalom) is first and foremost something profoundly personal and spiritual. It denotes an inner wholeness or well-being that is a gift from God flowing from faithfulness to God's covenant. When individuals entrust their lives to the Lord and follow his plan, they discover a deep inner peace within themselves, and it is this inner peace that flows into the world through right-ordered, harmonious relationship with others.
