CATECHETICAL CORNER

Precepts of the Church (Cont.)

The Third Precept: Every Catholic is supposed to go for the Sacrament of Penance at least once a year or whenever one is in grave sin. Only two Sacraments we can receive so often such as the Confession and the Eucharist. The faithful are expected to use these opportunities to receive the grace. Any person who is in mortal sins should receive the Sacrament of Penance (Confession) before he/she receives the Communion. By the third Precept every Catholic is supposed to go for the Sacrament of penance at least once a year and receive Communion. For convenience and considering the importance of the season, the Church instructs the faithful to make their Confession during the Lent or the Easter Season. Since the reception of any Sacrament brings us full grace, it is good that we make Confession regularly. This practice also will allow us to resist against temptations and avoid mortal sins.

<u>The Fourth Precept:</u> Catholics are expected to receive Communion at least once a year. This Precept is the repetition of the Third precept. The faithful are not only supposed to make Confession once a year but also receive the Holy Communion. Holy Eucharist is the second Sacrament which we can receive whenever we attend the Mass, provided we are not in mortal sins. If we are in venial sins, the Penitential Rite the priest does at the beginning of the Mass will make us worthy to receive the Communion worthily. When we have the wonderful opportunity of receiving the Sacrament of Penance and Holy Communion often, we should not be satisfied with the minimum.

<u>The Fifth Precept:</u> Support your Parish with financial contributions. The Council of Trent states: "It is the duty of the faithful to contribute to the support of religion according to our means, so that God may be duly honored and worshiped and the kingdom of his Church extended." It is the duty of the faithful, especially, to support the maintenance of their local Parish and the sustenance of the Pastor. As priests are not allowed to take up any income generating job or business their only source of sustenance is the generosity of the faithful. Unfortunately in the modern age everything is expensive and at the same time the Church doesn't have any source of income other than the generosity of the faithful. Together with the support of their local Parish the faithful are also expected to support of the maintenance of the Diocesan administration.

We hear the common complaints from the faithful, "The Church is always after our purses and wallets." This is a bit exaggeration. If the faithful want to see their Parish open for them, they have to support its up keeping. And also there are no other institutions in the world other than the Church which seek only nominal amount to maintain the Priests. For a Pastor he has no fixed hours of work; he should be available for his people 24x7. But at the same time he is the one who is less paid.

Every local church is the second home for its parishioners. They have an emotional attachment to their parish, as they have been baptized, confirmed, got married in the same church. Their children are also baptized and confirmed in the same church. That is why the Bishop tries their best to keep every Parish open. Unfortunately, due to lack of priests and lack of enough members the Bishops are forced to close the parishes, which is very heart rending for the members. Many Protestant denominations insist that their members should pay the tithe (10%) of their total income to the church. But Catholic Church doesn't keep that rule at all. She asks her members to do their best, remaining in their limitation of their resources. (Will be continued next week)
