CATECHETICAL CORNER

<u>SIN (Cont.)</u>

Division of Sin: *The two major divisions of Sin are: Original sin and Actual sin.* As we have already seen, the Original sin is what we inherited from the first sin of our first parents for which we are not responsible. The Original sin is washed away at the Baptism. But that does not make us free from committing other sins. The Actual sin is the one which we ourselves commit by misusing our free will and reasoning. We are responsible for every Actual sin we commit. The Actual sin is further divided into Mortal or Grave sin and Venial sin.

<u>Mortal sin:</u> Any sin is the offense against God's Law or the Commandments. But when it becomes a serious violation of the Law of God or His Commandments, that sin becomes a Moral sin. Mortal means that which kills the soul. The word itself speaks about the gravity of the matter. It is called mortal sin because it kills the supernatural life of the soul and makes the soul for the condemnation of eternal punishment. If a person dies in a Mortal sin without any chance of repentance he/she will be destined to eternal punishment. But at the same time Church is very careful in judging a person who has committed a Mortal sin apparently. In other words, though one act looks to be a serious one, doesn't mean that person who did that committed a Mortal sin. **In order for a sin to be mortal, it must meet three conditions.**

- 1. The matter itself is grave or it is the serious violation of any Commandment of God. For instance a willful murder is a serious matter in itself and the same comes under the Fifth Commandment. At the same time giving a bad example to someone also is the violation of the same Commandment, but the matter is not grave as the willful murder of someone.
- 2. A grave matter can become a Mortal sin, only when it is committed by somebody who has the full knowledge of the gravity of that matter. For instance, a woman who is not taught that abortion is a mortal sin, when she commits the same cannot be blamed of committing a Mortal sin. But at the same time willful ignorance will not excuse a person from the gravity of a Mortal sin. For example, a born Catholic who has every opportunity to learn about the Commandments and the teachings of the Church is supposed to learn what the Church teaches. He/she cannot make an excuse saying, "I didn't know about it."
- **3.** Mortal sin is committed with the deliberate consent of the sinner: Suppose, in a particular case the matter is grave and the person who commits it also knows that it is grave. But if he/she is forced by circumstances or by somebody to commit the action, he/she will not be responsible for that action; rather the person who induces the other to do it will be held responsible. For instance, murder is a grave matter and a civilized person with natural reasoning knows that it is a grave matter. But if he/she happened to murder somebody for self-defense or to save somebody else's life, or in a vehicle accident (not by pure negligence) somebody is killed, then it is not a grave sin.

The serious violation of the Ten Commandments is a Mortal sin. But at the same time, the Church has identified **Seven Vices as Capital Sins, which are mortal too. They are the following:**

- **1. Pride:** It is the excessive love of our own superiority. It blinds a us to the truth that all our good qualities are gifts from God and that others have the same or even greater gifts.
- 2. Covetousness: It is an excessive love of temporal goods, usually in terms of money and other material things. It makes a person hard-hearted, miserly about sharing with others, what he owns. Such persons always remain very eager to accumulate riches and power, no matter what means he/she uses.
