# **CATECHETICAL CORNER**

# SIN (Cont.)

<u>Seven Vices as Capital Sins:</u> Last week we saw the two of the seven vices such as, **Pride and Covetousness.** Let us see the rest of them in the following:

<u>3. Lust:</u> It is the inordinate desire for sexual pleasure. The desire is inordinate when sought outside the bonds and laws of matrimony. Sometimes the feeling of lust will creep into one's mind without any invitation. Once he/she knows about it the person should use all ways and means to get it out of mind. If not, the temptation will lead him/her to entertain it. And also one should not engage in watching or reading inappropriate materials which may push the person into lust.

**<u>4. Anger:</u>** It is a disorderly emotion that inclines a person to repel whatever displeases him; if it is not controlled, it can become hatred and lead one to seek revenge and to commit other serious crimes. Some people are short tempered by nature and such people should take maximum care to bring the anger under control. Remember, the older we become our control over anger also becomes less. In other words, we become easily irritated, impatient and provoked over small things.

**<u>5. Gluttony</u>**: It is an inordinate love of eating or drinking. It means eating or drinking to excess, taking a lot more than needed to satisfy the hunger or to maintain the good health. Once in a while, we all may eat some food a little excess on special occasions, which cannot be considered as gluttony.

**<u>6. Envy</u>**: It is the sadness experienced in seeing the talents, achievements, property, or success of others that a person feels being outshined by somebody. The person who is not satisfied with what he/she has will always look into the life of somebody and feels upset for not having the same. In order to be happy we need to be content with what we have and what we are. Don't worry about what we don't have or what others have. We should believe that God has given us enough for our good life.

**<u>7. Sloth</u>**: It is an excessive love of ease that leads a person to omit or neglect one's duties. It is laziness in full sense. Once in a while, we all feel a little lazy and not interested to do anything serious. Such situations don't come under sloth; but if it becomes a habit, it will lead us to sloth.

These above vices are called capital sins because they are the sources from which all other sins take their root. But at the same time the Church suggests **Seven Virtues** which we can practice against these vices. The following are the Capital Sins and their contrary Virtues.

# 1. Pride vs Humility; Covetousness vs Liberality; 3. Lust vas Chastity; 4. Anger vs Meekness; 5; Gluttony vs Temperance; 6. Envy vs Brotherly Love; 7. Sloth vs Diligence.

It is the human tendency that easily we fall into the traps of vices; but at the same time to practice a virtue contrary to a particular vice is more difficult and we have to struggle hard to do so. Remember, it is not impossible to practice virtues in our lives and they are essential for our well-being and eternal life. So it is worth to make some sacrifices to practice them. We need to keep in mind the effects of the mortal sin. The effects are the loss of divine friendship, past supernatural merits, and the right to enter heaven unless the sinner repents. The supernatural life of the soul lost by committing the mortal sin can be restored by the Sacrament of Penance (Confession) and good act of contrition. At the same time the confession of sins to a priest will never do any good, unless we repent truly and make efforts to correct our ways. In other words, we have to reconcile with God and our fellowmen.
