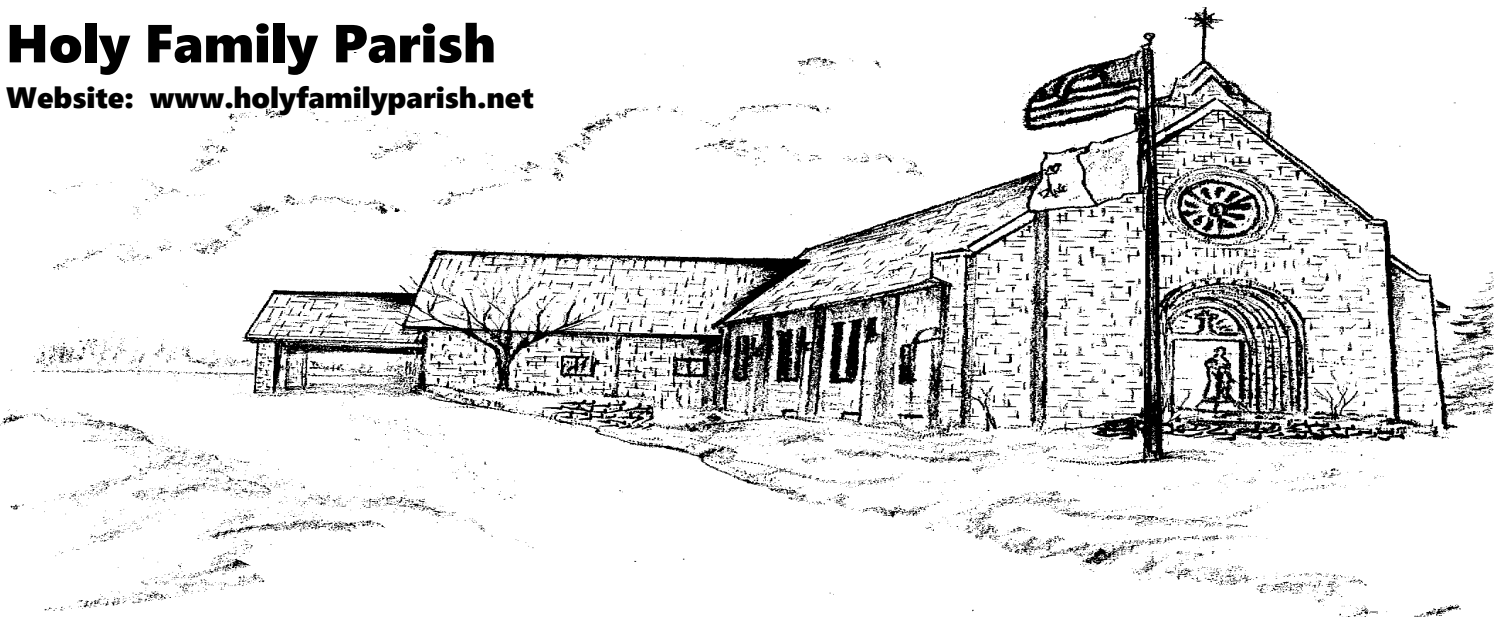

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Nearly 400 years ago Jesuit missionaries serving in the Eastern U.P. brought our Catholic faith to the Bay Mills area. Tragically, a fire in May 2021 at St. Kateri Parish there resulted in the complete loss of the church building and contents. While this was and remains a great heartache for the parishioners, they have only lost their church building, not their faith.

After diligent planning, they are now ready to begin building a new, beautiful church, a sacred place to worship God. Gratefully, the insurance will cover the cost of building the church to replace what was lost.

Unfortunately, new construction will require moving power lines and a power pole at the cost of \$80,000 to \$100,000 dollars – a cost not covered by insurance. This is more than the small parish can raise. Thus, I am asking that all the parishes in the diocese take up a special collection on to assist our sisters and brothers at St. Kateri. Any amount raised above the cost to relocate the power pole will go to benefit Native American ministry in the Diocese of Marquette.

Thank you for your generosity in helping our brothers and sisters. May God bless you abundantly for your kindness.
