# **CATECHETICAL CORNER**

# **Virtues**

#### **Love of Neighbor (Cont.):**

It is not hard for us to love our dear ones and friends and we enjoy their company and friendship. But it is hard to understand and accept the demand of Jesus who says, "Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you." Most of us feel hard to love and tolerate our enemies who hurt our feelings. When Jesus asks us to love our enemies, does he mean that we have to love even the social enemies like the terrorists, murderers, child molesters and all evil doers as we love our dear ones? How can we love those who persecute us and the innocent people? Of course, as human beings, it is rather impossible for us to equally love these people as we love our family members and friends.

In order to understand the meaning of the command of Jesus we need a little better understanding of the word **Love.** In English language the same word love is used to express different types of love, such as love between lovers, love between spouses, parents and children, love to our friends, love for our pets etc. But in Greek language **there are four types of love** which express four different types of love. 1. *Storge:* the love between parents and children is known under this type. 2. *Eros:* this is the type of love we see between husbands and wives and lovers. This is the sexual and passionate love existing among these people. 3. *Philia:* the warmest love seen among the siblings and close friends is known under this name. 4. *Agape:* this love is different from other three types of love. The word indicates unconquerable benevolence and invisible goodwill. If we regard people with Agape, it means that no matter what they do to us, no matter how they treat us, no matter if they insult us or injure us or grieve us, we will never allow any bitterness against them to invade our hearts; but will regard them with that unconquerable benevolence and goodwill which will seek nothing but their highest good. In short, we will never wish that our enemies would perish or some big loss would happen to them. This is the type of love Jesus expects from. No doubt, he is not asking us to love our enemies as we love our spouses, parents and friends.

#### **GRACE**

#### What is grace as a virtue?

In popular language and Ecclesiastical language we hear the word Grace being used in different senses. We are familiar with the saying, 'Let us begin our meal by saying Grace.' Sometimes people speak about the elegant and beautiful appearance of a person using the phrase 'graceful look.' Very often we invite people to participate in a great event using the phrase, 'grace the occasion with your valuable presence.' Sometimes the students are given extra time to pay their loan, known as grace period. These are some of the common or popular usages of the word 'grace.'

In Ecclesiastical language Grace has got divine and deeper meaning. It has been defined as the divine influence which operates in humans to regenerate and sanctify, to inspire virtuous impulses, and to impart strength to endure trial and resist temptation; and as an individual virtue or excellence of divine origin. In the definition of the Catechism of the Catholic Church, "Grace is the favor, the free and undeserved help that God gives us to respond to His call to become children of God, adoptive sons, partakers of the divine nature and of eternal life.

Grace is a supernatural gift that, through the merits of Jesus Christ, God freely bestows on human beings in order to bring them to eternal life. Nature is what we are born with and into, when we enter this world; grace is what we still need to enter heaven in the world to come. Grace is a participation in the life of God, which is poured unearned into beings, whom it heals of sin and sanctifies. The means by which God grants his grace are many. They include the entirety of revealed truth, the Sacraments and hierarchical ministry. Among the principal means of grace are the Sacraments, **especially, the Eucharist, prayers and good works.** The Sacramentals also are means of grace. The Sacraments themselves, no matter how unworthy is the person who administer it, are the means of Grace. But for the effectiveness of Grace the recipient should be in proper disposition.
