CATECHETICAL CORNER

GRACE (Cont.)

Actual Grace: Actual Grace derives its name, 'actual' from the Latin word actualis (ad actum), for it is granted by God for the performance of salutary acts and is present and disappears with the action itself. Its opposite, therefore, is not possible Grace, which is without usefulness or importance, but Habitual or Sanctifying Grace, which causes a state of holiness, so that the mutual relations between these two kinds of Grace are relation between action and state, not those between actuality and potentiality. As to Actual Grace, we have to examine: (1) its Nature; (2) its Properties. Actual Grace is a supernatural help from God by which he enlightens a person's mind and moves the will to do good and avoid evil for the sake of eternal life. Unlike Sanctifying Grace, Actual grace is not a quality that dwells in the soul. It is rather a holy thought or holy desire from God that leads a person to perform a supernatural action that is naturally impossible to do.

Actual Grace is like little nudges from God. These nudges can take many different forms and come to us from many different places and people. Actual Grace could come in the form of our mother reminding you not to miss Mass on Sunday, or a friend telling you that you should get to confession. It could be a catastrophic event which leaves you on your knees before God, when before you wouldn't have gone near Him. It could be the promptings of your own conscience when confronted with your sins. It might be a class you took or a book you read which compelled you in the direction of justice or righteousness or humility. It could be the unexpected presence of a holy person or the feeling of awe you get when you look at a coastal sunset. It could be just about anything which moves you closer to the Lord.

Actual Grace can be acted on or it can be ignored; but just like a train, there will always be another nudge coming around soon. God never abandons anyone, and every human being on the planet receives as much Actual Grace as is necessary to prompt one to seek out salvation. Unlike Sanctifying Grace, Actual Grace does not touch the interior of a person, but only works from the outside. Actual Grace does not change the state of a person's souls, but is merely the agent that pushes a soul to seek out and receive Sanctifying Grace.

Just to fresh up our memory on Sanctifying Grace, please remember, Sanctifying Grace differs from Actual Grace in several ways. Actual Grace is a transient gift which lasts only during the action. Sanctifying Grace remains with us unless lost by mortal sin; Actual Grace is still communicated even if we do not possess Sanctifying Grace; if Sanctifying Grace is lost it cannot be recovered without Actual Grace, nor can Sanctifying Grace be preserved for any length of time without the assistance of Actual Grace. Sanctifying and Actual Grace are both supernatural, since both are far above the powers of unaided nature. They are directly given

Actual Grace are both supernatural, since both are far above the powers of unaided nature. They are directly given by God out of sheer love for us.

<u>Division of Actual Grace</u>: The logical division of Actual Grace should enumerate all kinds to which the definition is universally applicable. If we adopt different faculties of the soul as our principle of division, we shall have two kinds: **Graces of the Intellect and of the Will**. With regard to the consent of the will we distinguish two pairs of Graces; first, preventing and co-operating; then efficacious and merely sufficient Grace. It must be immediately shown that all these Graces are not arbitrarily invented entities, but actually existing realities.

<u>Divine Illuminations of the Intellect:</u> The illuminating Grace of the Intellect first presents itself for consideration. It is that Grace which in the work of salvation suggests good thoughts to the intellect. Divine Inspirations are, first of all, Actual Graces insofar they enlighten the mind to see what is already there. Illuminations also confer knowledge not yet possessed and that, except for Grace, the mind would not possess.
