Title: Why is Life so Hard

There are no exceptions, all families have broken pieces that we try to put back together. Many people can be heard saying something like this; "Jesus, where are you? Will I ever feel normal again...the hurt, the pain, the uncertainty, the grief, the loneliness, the depression, my children, my grandchildren, the anxiousness, I am a real person with real pain...is there an answer for me?"

The great news is, yes, there is an answer. We will be using what is called the "Lectio Divina" format to dig deep into scripture for both your individual answer and find out what God's collective answer is for our society today.

Lectio Divina is more than simply reading scripture. Using prayer and meditation principles, while reading Holy Scripture, the practice is intended to promote deeper communion with God and to increase our knowledge of God's word. St. Jerome said, "to be ignorant of Scripture is to be ignorant of Christ." This class will intentionally ground each of us in Holy Scripture. Lectio Divina does not treat Scripture as simply 'text to be studied', but as the living word of God, which provides definitive answers to all of life's questions.

Please consider attending. You will not be disappointed! To borrow a quote from Bishop Fulton Sheen, "Far better it is for you to say I am a sinner than to say I have no need of Religion. Those who are empty can be filled but the self-intoxicated have no room for God."

Sample size discussion point: "Money is an article which may be used as a universal passport to get you everywhere you want to go except heaven. It is also a universal provider of everything you desire except happiness."
