CATECHETICAL CORNER

PRAYER (Cont.)

To Whom we Pray: Prayer can be addressed to a specific Person of the Holy Trinity; Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Liturgical prayer usually includes all three Persons of the Holy Trinity in its formulae. The prayer may initially address God the Father but then end with a phrase that includes the other Persons of the Trinity; "through our Lord Jesus who lives and reigns with the Holy Spirit." If the prayer is initially addressed to the Son it ends with:"who lives and reigns with God the Father in union with the Holy Spirit." The prayer can take an intermediate course through the saints too.

<u>Why should I pray:</u> We may argue that God knows my needs and why should I pray to Him. He can just grant me what I need. As I have mentioned it in the beginning, to improve or establish our intimacy with God dialogue with God through prayer is the only means. Even Jesus prayed to His Father on number of occasions. In fact, he started his public ministry after spending forty days in prayer. In Matthew 7:7 Jesus makes it very clear, "Ask, and it will be given you; see, and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you." Please read the parable of the Persistent widow in Luke 18: 1-8 who went on asking the judge to do her justice against her opponent. Finally, due to her persistence alone she got what she wanted. Another important reason to pray is that it changes the person who prays. By communicating with God slowly we will come to know His will and that will make changes in our lives.

Types of Prayer

<u>Vocal Prayer</u>: The word itself shows that it is something we utter through our voice. In vocal prayer the words used are determined beforehand. They are the words of someone else which we pray through a prayer book. The private vocal prayer is recited either loudly or silently by a single individual praying alone. Whereas public vocal prayer is the community prayer which is sung or recited by several people in a group. The best example of the public vocal prayer is the liturgy of the hour, the official prayer prescribed by the Catholic Church. The liturgical prayer or the liturgy of the hour is the most excellent prayer because it is offered in the name of the Church to the Trinitarian God. Sometimes the minister prays for on behalf of the congregation and other times the congregation prays together a Psalm or Our Father etc.

Mental Prayer: Another type of prayer is mental prayer where no prescribed formula or words are there. The person who prays uses his/her own words spontaneously and it is not necessary that the words be audible while praying. In this prayer the person expresses whatever needs he/she has or any sentiments like, sadness, frustration etc. to God. Mental prayer very often becomes very personal and heart touching.

Meditation: Another type of prayer is meditation which is also a mental prayer in which the mind is occupied with reflecting on divine things. It could be done by reading a special passage from the Bible or other book and then reflect over it. But many people find it hard to keep the mind from wandering when they do the meditation or mental prayer. In this type of prayer our higher faculties are used such as intellect, imagination and memory.

Matter of Prayer: It is a lot easier to say what we can exclude from the matter of prayer than what we can include in our prayers. God is willing to hear from us anything which bothers us and any specific needs we have in mind. Yet some specific areas of concern should be regular items for our prayer. These include asking for grace to persevere in the Christian life and faith, to resist temptation, and to grow in virtue and the guidance of the Holy Spirit in daily life. But in the matter we ask for, should be worthy of God and for the good of the person whom we pray for. (We will continue).
