THE BIBLE STUDY The Gospel of Luke

LUKE 4: 1-13; The Temptations of Jesus

Setting: These events take place in two significant locations: the wilderness and Jerusalem. Historically, the wilderness is closely connected to the life of the people of Israel. This was the place where God met the Jewish people at Sinai after rescuing them from Egypt. In the wilderness God shaped them into God's covenant people, cared for and led by God with cloud and fire. In Luke's Gospel, Jesus is also led, this time by the Holy Spirit, in the wilderness, and he faces temptation by his adversary, the devil. Here the wilderness is located in Palestine itself. Between the southern Palestine and the Dead Sea stretched a terrible wilderness, thirty-five by fifteen miles. It was called Jeshimmon, which means 'the devastation.' The hills were like dust heaps. This was the area where Jesus spent forty days in prayer and fasting and part of the three temptations also took place here. It was not totally devoid of life such as one might imagine if thinking about the sands of the Sahara desert but was rather a place that only produced food for flocks when there were abundant rains.

Jerusalem, the city of David, is the center of Jewish power, identity, and worship. At the time of Jesus, the second temple had been renovated and expanded by Herod the Great and was the center of worship for the Jewish people. This place of power and worship is the setting for the final temptation.

Luke 4:14-30: Inauguration of the Ministry:

After defeating the temptations or the devil Jesus determined what should be the nature of his Mission and he has chosen Galilee to be the place of his inaugural address. Galilee was an area in the north of Palestine about fifty miles from north to south and twenty five miles from east to west. It was circled by non-Jewish nations. Having been influenced by the gentile culture, Galilee was least conservative part of Palestine. It had over 204 villages or towns with over 3 million people living.

It was the most fertile land with all sorts of fruit trees and other cultivations. People were ever fond of innovations and by nature disposed to changes, and delighted in seditions. They were ever ready to follow a leader who would begin an insurrection. They were quick in temper and given to quarrelling. This is the land which Jesus chose to begin his Ministry.

Jesus began his preaching in the Jewish synagogue which was the center of Jewish religious life. There was only one Temple which was in Jerusalem; but the law said that wherever there were ten Jewish families there must be a synagogue where people gathered on Sabbath for worship. It is amazing that Jesus got an entry in a synagogue to preach, though he was not yet a recognized as a rabbi.

The synagogue service had three parts: 1) The worship part, in which prayers were offered. 2) The reading of the Scriptures which were read by seven people from the congregation. 3) The teaching part. In the synagogue there was neither professional ministry nor any one person to give the address; the president would invite any distinguished person present in the congregation to speak, and discussion and talk would follow. That is why Jesus got his chance. Luke says that people held Jesus in high esteem. That means, the people were impressed by his preaching, though we are not sure on what subject he spoke.
