CATECHETICAL CORNER Virtues (Cont.)

<u>Cardinal virtues: JUSTICE:</u> As a virtue, it is the constant and permanent determination to give everyone his or her rightful due. It is a habitual inclination of the will and therefore always recognizes each one's rights, under any and all circumstances. The rights in question are whatever belongs to a person as an individual who is distinct from the one who practices justice. The essence of justice, then, as compared with charity, consists in the distinction between a person and his or her neighbor; whereas charity is based on the union existing between the one who loves and the person loved so that the practice of charity regards the neighbor as another self.

The Moral Virtues can be diminished or lost just as they are acquired: directly, by the repetition of acts that are opposed to the virtues, which not only destroy the virtues but also replace them with the opposite vice. They can be lost by not performing the good acts or keeping indifference to them.

<u>**Theological Virtues --**</u> They are the supernatural virtues which are infused in the souls by God to enable one to act on a supernatural level. They are the virtues of faith, hope and charity. The natural virtues on the contrary which are acquired by human activity are habits of the soul which incline it to do good.

FAITH - Faith is a supernatural virtue by which we believe all the truths which God has revealed. Faith is called supernatural because it is directly infused in the soul by God, because what we believe is the revealed truth, and because it is necessary for our salvation. The virtue of faith is absolutely necessary for our salvation because no one can be saved without sanctifying grace; and sanctifying grace cannot exist without the habitual faith. Christ himself said, "He who doe s not believe will be condemned" (Mk 16:16).

Faith is a gift from God and by our personal effort we are not going to acquire it unless God gives it. But we can desire for faith and pray for that great gift. Though we cannot acquire faith we can lose it by our own carelessness. It can be lost by neglecting to know what we are bound to believe; by not making an honest effort to understand what we believe and why; by not performing acts of faith, through internal belief and external profession of what we believe; and by failing to strengthen our faith through the Sacraments of Penance and the Eucharist and through constant prayer. Once we are given the gift of faith, it is our duty to make all possible efforts and means to persevere in faith. We need to avoid all sorts of evils and temptations and constantly pray for the power to keep our faith. The main sins against faith are the omission are heresy (if anything God has revealed is doubted or denied), apostasy (if everything is doubted or denied). Of course, we all have natural and reasonable doubts about many supernatural things. But it is our duty to use all means to get our doubts clarified and then believe.

HOPE - The virtue of Hope is a supernatural virtue by which we firmly trust that God will give us heaven in the life to come, and in this life will provide all the means we need to reach heaven. The foundation of hope is our belief that God is faithful to His promises. Hope is a supernatural virtue because of its purpose and the way it is received. Its purpose is to lead us to the eternal salvation to which we have no natural right or claim. It can be received only by a special gift of God's grace, and not by any merely natural effort on our part. When we speak about Hope we are not mainly hoping only for a happy earthly life rather our object of Hope is

When we speak about Hope we are not mainly hoping only for a happy earthly life rather our object of Hope is everlasting happiness, the possession of eternal life. The virtue of Hope is necessary because it is the link between Faith and Charity. We must believe in something before we can hope to obtain it. Our Hope enables us to love what we are looking forward to attain. St. Paul says, "We must hope to be saved since we are not saved yet" (Rom 8:25). Like the virtue of Faith, we can only desire and pray for Hope and we cannot acquire it merely by our personal effort. Once we have received this great gift from God it is our duty to use all possible means to preserve it. All the adults with sound reason are supposed to make the acts of Hope. We have to make the acts of Hope often especially when we are discouraged or frustrated.

We may lose the virtue of Hope especially committing sins against Hope by presumption and despair. The sin of presumption is that we simply presuppose that we can be saved without the help of God.
