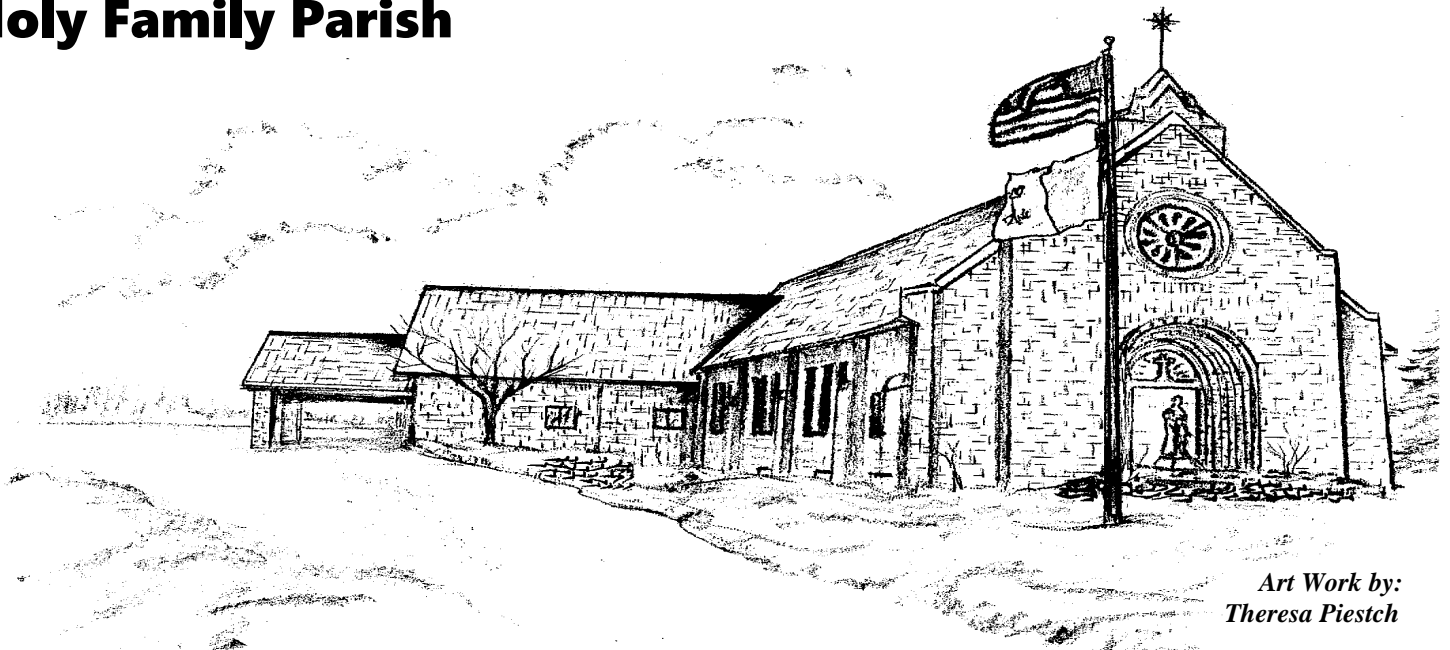

# CATECHETICAL CORNER

## Prayer (Cont.)

### Types of Prayer:

**2. Vocal prayer:** the word itself shows that it is something we utter through our voice. In vocal prayer the words used are determined beforehand. They are the words of someone else which we pray through a prayer book. The private vocal prayer is recited either loudly or silently by a single individual praying alone. Whereas a public vocal prayer is the community prayer which is sung or recited by several people in a group. The best example of the public vocal prayer is the liturgy of the hour, the official prayer prescribed by the Catholic Church. The liturgical prayer or the liturgy of the hour is the most excellent prayer because it is offered in the name of the Church to the Trinitarian God. Sometimes the minister prays for on behalf of the congregation and other times the congregation prays together a Psalm or Our Father etc.

**2. Mental prayer:** Another type of the prayer is mental prayer where no prescribed formula or words are there. The person who prays uses his/her own words spontaneously and it is not necessary that the words be audible while praying. In this prayer the person expresses whatever needs he/she has or any sentiments like, sadness, frustration, love, thanksgiving etc. to God.

**3. Meditation:** Another type of prayer is mental prayer in which the mind is occupied with reflecting on divine things. It could be done by reading a special passage from the Bible or other book and then reflect over it. But many people find it hard to keep the mind from wandering when they do the meditation or mental prayer. In this type of prayer our higher faculties are used such as intellect, imagination and memory.

### MATTER OF PRAYER

It is a lot easier to say what we can exclude from the matter of prayer than what we can include in our prayers. God is willing to hear from us anything which bothers us and any specific needs we have in mind. Yet some specific areas of concern should be regular items for prayer. These include asking for grace to persevere in the Christian life and faith, to resist temptation, and to grow in virtue and the guidance of the Holy Spirit in daily life. But in the matter we ask for, should be worthy of God and for the good of the person who prays or for whom we pray. For example, I hate my neighbor and I pray to God that he/she should fall sick, or lose the job or any mishap should happen. This is not a worthy subject.

The example of the most perfect prayer is the only prayer Jesus taught his disciples, “The Our Father.” It has got all the necessary matters of prayer. First of all it begins with acknowledging God as our Father, then we praise God saying, hallowed be thy name; we seek the ‘Kingdom’ of God and his ‘Will’ be done on earth. Then the person turns to God for favor, the daily bread, forgiveness of sins and protection from temptations of the world and deliverance from evil. But we also add a condition here with Lord that he need to forgive us only as far as we forgive the iniquities of others.

Prayer has four types of matter. *As creatures we owe God worship, so **adoration** is the first matter of prayer. Then, there comes the **thanksgiving** for the blessings we receive from him specially or on daily basis. The begging of **forgiveness** is important in every prayer we make. Finally, we add the needs or **petitions**.* Very often we are so frustrated over our over whelming needs and right away we start asking God for only what we need.
