CATECHETICAL CORNER <u>Prayer (Cont.)</u>

Attitudes of Prayer (Cont.): Modern life is so hectic that both young and old are busy running. Unfortunately, these days it is very hard for the young families to come together for a family meal. After the work, the parents don't have much time left to spend some time with the children. So naturally, it is the basic tendency in us to skip the prayer or the weekend Mass. I cannot skip my job, I cannot skip my doctor's appointment, I cannot skip the children's sports and games. Then what I can skip is my time with the Lord and I feel that if I can steal the half hour or one hour from God I can accomplish a lot more. Some people find time for everything in their lives, but with simple excuses they skip the personal prayer and weekend Mass. St Francis De Sales says that every person should pray at least half hour daily; but if he/she is busy, let it be for one hour. We read in the gospels how Jesus left the crowd and went into the deserted place for personal prayer. It is simply an excuse to complain, "I don't have time for prayer." If I have got time for everything else, no doubt, if willing, I can find some time with the Lord too. Of course by spending some time with Lord we will never make any change in His life; rather it will make changes in our lives for good. The most perfect prayer we can offer to the Lord is our participation in a Eucharistic Celebration. The value of a single Mass will surpass all our personal prayers and devotions we make. But at the same time the personal prayer has its place and role to play in our day to day life. It may not be possible for many of you to attend the daily Mass. So our personal prayer will keep up our intimacy with the Lord. Please remember, Good Lord grants us 24 hours daily and thus 168 hours a week; out of which God is asking from us half our daily and at least an hour in the Eucharistic Celebration.

SAINTS IN THE CHURCH

Devotion to the Saints: Only in Catholic Church you find a long list of Saints and there exists a practice of devotion to many of the Saints. In the devotion to the Saints, we are not worshiping any Saint including Blessed Virgin Mary. We just pray to a Particular Saint to intercede with the Lord for our cause. By their outstanding virtues and qualities they are very dear to God. The devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary is very popular in Catholic Church which causes some confusion and misunderstanding among our Protestant brethren. But the Church considers her only as a powerful intercessor for us. The rosary is the most popular devotion to the Blessed Mary and it is a powerful devotion too. Many newly converted Christians to Catholicism wonder, 'Do we need devotion to the Saints for our eternal salvation?' Not at all, Jesus Christ is the only way, the truth and life and only through him salvation is possible. But the saints can help us in many ways as they are closer to the Lord.

<u>Canonization of Saints</u>: Catholic Christians are very familiar with Saints in the Church. It is said that so far we have over 10,000 Canonized and Beatified Holy Men and Women in the Catholic Church who are worthy of our veneration. Unfortunately, we celebrate the feasts of only a few in the calendar year and pretty much everybody is familiar with them. It may be true that even many Catholics are not very knowledgeable about the process by which one is chosen to be a saint. So in this article we will make a study tour on the Canonization process to Sainthood.

Canonization, the process the Church uses to name a saint, has only been used since the tenth century. For hundreds of years, starting with the first martyrs of the early Church, saints were chosen by public acclaim. Though this was a more democratic way to recognize saints, some saints' stories were distorted by legend and some never existed. Gradually, the bishops and finally the Vatican took over authority for approving saints. Currently a candidate for sainthood has to undergo very strict four steps before he/she is canonized.

Contrary to the common belief that there are 3 steps to becoming a saint, the Catholic Church teaches that there are 4 steps for becoming a saint. Many teachers of this matter omit the first step. Before a person can be considered for sainthood, he/she must have been dead for at least 5 years. It can be waived by the Supreme Pontiff, and has been done on two occasions. Pope John Paul II waived 5 years of the waiting period in the case of Mother Theresa of Calcutta, and Pope Benedict XVI waived all five years in the case of his predecessor, Pope John Paul II.
