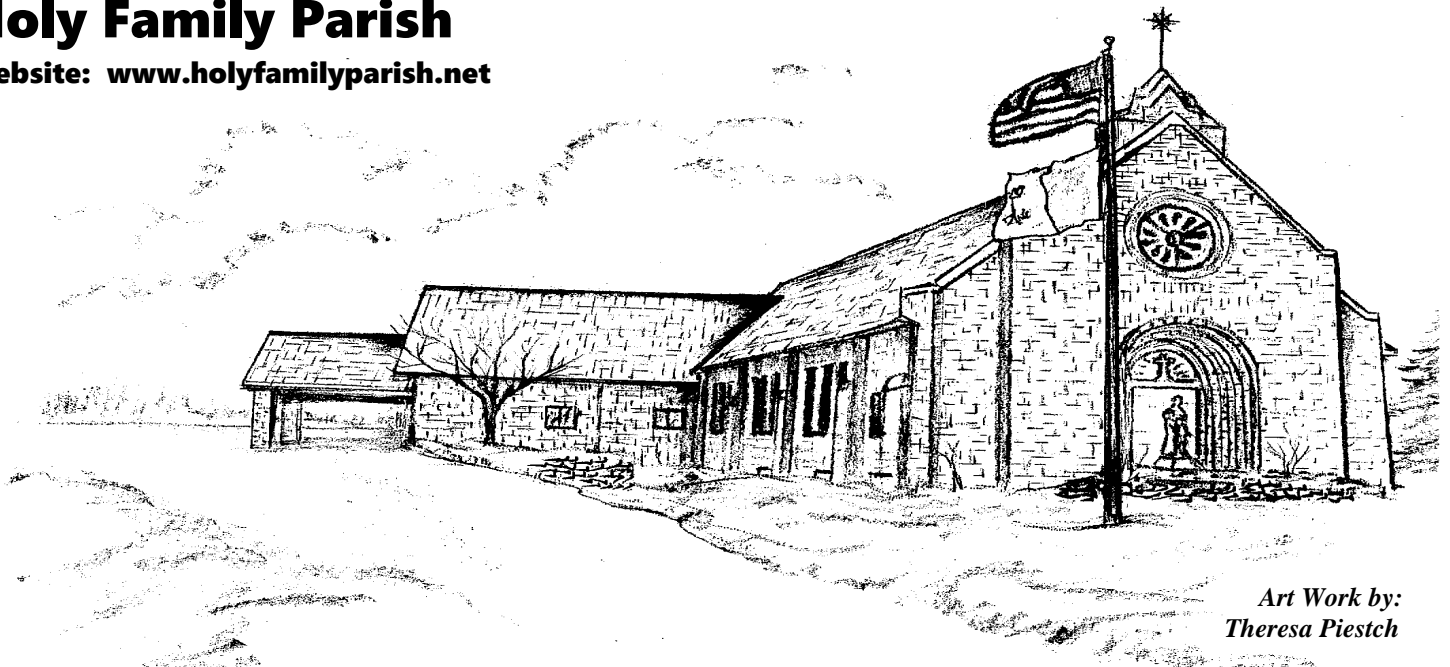

CATECHETICAL CORNER

Catholic Devotions (Rosary)

Rosary (Con.) LUMINOUS MYSTERIES

Luminous Mystery or the Mysteries of Light, as they are also called, focus on the public life of Jesus, the years He was preaching spanning the time between His Baptism and His death.

They are called the Mysteries of Light because Jesus is the light of the World.

Jesus as the light is mentioned several times in St. John's Gospel.

"And the light shines in darkness: and the darkness did not overcome it. A man named John was sent from God. He came for testimony, to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. He was not the light, but came to testify to the light. The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world." - **John 1:5-9**

"While I am in the world, I am the light of the world" -**John 9:5**

Pope John Paul II felt that it was important to add these mysteries to the history of the rosary because there was a big gap between the Joyful Mysteries and Sorrowful Mysteries. And the Luminous Mysteries which speak about the public life of Jesus fill that gap and give a continuation of the life of Jesus, till the beginning of his passion described in the Sorrowful Mysteries.

First Luminous Mystery: The Baptism of Lord

1. John is baptizing in the Jordan proclaiming a baptism of repentance.
2. "I am the voice of one crying in the desert; make straight the way of the Lord."
3. "One mightier than I is coming after me."
4. "I have baptized you with water; He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."
5. Seeing Jesus, John exclaims: "Behold the Lamb of God."
6. After Jesus' baptism a voice comes down from Heaven: "This is my Beloved Son in whom I am well pleased."
7. The Spirit descends upon Jesus in the form of a dove.
8. In this heavenly manifestation is instituted the Sacrament of Baptism.
9. The divine Trinity is manifested: the voice of the Father is heard as the Spirit descends upon the Son.
10. Filled with the Holy Spirit, Jesus was led by the Spirit into the desert for 40 days.

Second Luminous Mystery: The wedding at Cana

1. Jesus, his Mother and the disciples were invited to the wedding at Cana.
2. During the celebration the wine ran short.
3. Mary notices that and turned to Jesus: "They have no wine."
4. Jesus replied: "Woman, how does your concern affect me? My hour has not yet come."
5. Mary said to the waiters: "Do whatever he tells you."
6. There were six stone water jars, each holding fifteen to twenty gallons.
7. Jesus bids the waiters to fill the jars with water, and then draw some out and take it to the chief steward.
8. The chief steward said to the groom: "Everyone serves good wine first, and then when people have drunk freely, an inferior one; but you have kept the good wine until now."
9. At Mary's request Jesus worked this miracle or as John calls it the 'sign.'
10. By his presence, Christian marriage raised to the dignity of a Sacrament.

The Third Luminous Mystery: Jesus proclaims the Kingdom of God

1. "Repent, for the kingdom of God is at hand."
2. "My kingdom is not of the world."
3. "Unless a man be born again of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of heaven."
4. "Whoever does not accept the kingdom of God as a little child will not enter into it."
5. "I have come to call sinners, not the just."
6. "Love your enemies, pray for those who persecute you."
7. "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven."
8. "Blessed are they who hunger and thirst for justice, for they shall be satisfied."
9. "Blessed are they who are persecuted for righteousness sake, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven."
10. "You Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church.... I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven."

SPIRIT LIFTERS

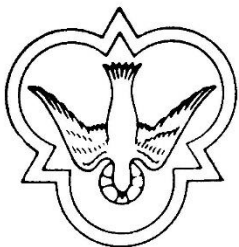
- Oct. 9th** - It requires moral courage, Christian maturity, And spiritual strength To show others our weakness.
