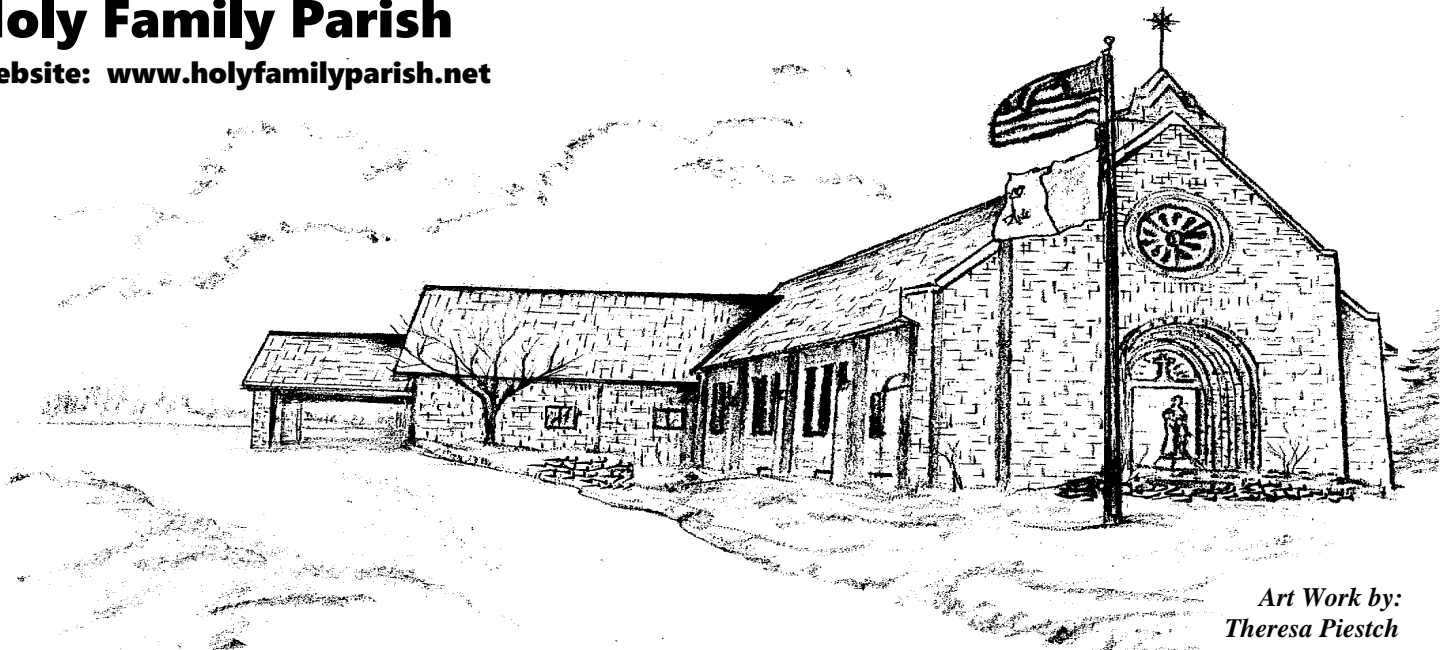

CATECHETICAL CORNER

Devotion to the Rosary (Cont.) The Glorious Mysteries

The Glorious Mysteries speak about the glorious moments of Jesus as well as the Blessed Virgin Mary. The first two Mysteries show us the most glorious moments in Jesus' life, the Resurrection and the Ascension. The third Mystery speaks about the greatest gift of the Holy Spirit whom Jesus gave to his disciples and his Mother to support their future mission. The last two Mysteries honor the Blessed Mother showing her glorious moments in her life, the greatest reward given her for her amazing role in the salvific mission of Jesus. The Glorious Mysteries are the happy conclusion of the Sorrowful Mysteries.

The First Glorious Mystery- The Resurrection of the Lord:

Points for meditation:

1. The body of Jesus is placed in the tomb on the evening of Good Friday.
2. His soul descends in the realm of the dead to announce to the just the tidings of their redemption.
3. Fearing the body of Jesus will be taken away by the disciples, the chief priests place the guards at the tomb.
4. On the third day Jesus rises from the dead, glorious and immortal.
5. The earth quakes as the angel rolls back the stone, the guards flee in terror.
6. The holy women coming to anoint the body of Jesus are amazed and frightened to find the tomb open.
7. An angel calms their fears: "He is not here. He has risen as he said."
8. Jesus appears to Mary Magdalene and Peter and two disciples on the way to Emmaus.
9. That evening he appears to the apostles behind the locked doors: "Peace be with you.. do not be afraid."
10. Jesus breaths on them and gives them the power of the Holy Spirit and authority to forgive sins.

The Second Glorious Mystery: The Ascension of the Lord:

1. Jesus remains on earth forty days after his Resurrection to prove he has truly risen from the dead.
2. He commissions the apostles to preach the gospel to every creature, and promises to be with them forever.
3. He will not leave them orphans, but will send the Holy Spirit to enlighten and strengthen them.
4. Jesus proceeds to Mount of Olive accompanied by his disciples.
5. Extending his hands over all in a last blessing, then he ascends into heaven.
6. As he ascends a cloud takes him from their sight.
7. Jesus takes his place at the right hand of his Father.
8. What jubilation there must be amid the angels of heaven on the triumphant entry of Jesus!
9. The wounds in his glorified body of Jesus are an endless plea before the Father on our behalf.
10. The disciples leave the Mount of Olive and return to Jerusalem with great joy.
