

CATECHETICAL CORNER

Devotion to Rosary

The Fourth Glorious Mystery: The Assumption of the Bl. Virgin:

- 1. After the apostles have dispersed, the Blessed Mother goes to live with John, the beloved disciple of Jesus.
- 2. Mary lives, perhaps, many more years after the Ascension of Jesus.
- 3. She is a source of comfort, consolation and strength to the apostles.
- 4. As she nourished the Infant Jesus, so she nourishes the Infant Church.
- 5. Mary dies, not of bodily infirmity, but is wholly ravished in a rapture of divine love.
- 6. Her body as well as her soul is taken up into heaven.
- 7. Jesus does not permit the sinless body of his Mother to decay in the grave.
- 8. Corruption of the body is an effect of original sin from which Mary is totally exempted.
- 9. The bodies of all mankind, at the last judgment, will be brought back and united again to the soul.

The Fifth Glorious Mystery: The Coronation of the Bl. Virgin in heaven:

- 1. As Mary enters heaven, the entire court of heaven greets her with joy.
- 2. Traditional belief holds that Mary is crowned by her Divine Son as Queen of heaven and earth.
- 3. Only in heaven will we know the great majesty of that coronation, and the joy it gave to the angels and saints.
- 4. Mary shares so fully in the glory of Christ because she shared so fully in his suffering.
- 5. Only in heaven will we see how central the role of Mary is in the divine plan of redemption.
- 6. Mary pleads our cause as a most powerful Queen and a most merciful and loving Mother.
- 7. A great sign appeared in heaven; a woman clothed with the sun, the moon under her feet, and on her head a crown of twelve stars.

Here we conclude our journey through the Mysteries of the Holy Rosary. For more than 2000 years the Rosary remained a very powerful intercessory prayer for the Catholics, through which they have received blessings from the Blessed Mother especially in their crisis. So, the Rosary is not an outdated or old fashioned prayer to be avoided. It is good that we recite it daily and we need to teach our younger kids the importance of the Rosary and teach them the habit of reciting it daily.
